NOTES:

1. The immigration deposit reflected in "Expenditure" was paid on behalf of a delegate. This money will be refunded by the Immigration department.
2. Tea for delegates ~~xxxx~~ was made when delegates returned from the trip.
3. Taxi for D.A.S. and Marie was in connection with arrangements that had to be made in the last minute to hire cars for delegates who could not be accommodated in the leries.
4. The fines paid was in connection with the arrest of the lorry driver of Mungal's Lorry. This amount was deducted from the amount that had to be paid to Mungal.
5. The loan from Pahad was taken by Raymond. This amount ~~xxx~~ is reflected in payments made to lorry drivers.
6. The Loan from Patel was in payment of the Je'burg Lorry which charged £60. We paid £30, and the balance was paid by Patel.
7. When Mungal's Lorry driver was arrested at Standerten the delegates made a collection which is reflected on the Income side of the above statement. Two members of the ANC loaned the balance that was needed. This has to be paid back soon.
8. The COD promised £15 £20 towards the expenses. On the strength of this promise we made a loan. But, now we understand that the COD is paying only £15, and that the balance of £5 will be paid back to their delegate Mr Fletcher.
9. The ANC, until almost the very last moment, intended to make its own arrangements for their delegates. But, on the day of the departure of these delegates they decided to join all the other delegates. This put the organisers in very serious difficulties as the ANC had over 60 delegates and they had only collected enough money ~~xxx~~ to pay for one lorry. Even this lorry, unlike the others, only carried 22 delegates up to Standerten.

- 10. This resulted in us having to hire another Lorry from Je'burg which cost us a further £80. and at the same time we ~~WERE~~ had to hire two cars to take these delegates whose places in the lorries had been taken by the ANC delegates. These cars cost us £50.
- 11. Therefore, our budgeting was thrown completely out of gear as we had to find an extra £80 over and above the amount we had collected.
- 12. The following accounts in connection with Transport of delegates have still to be met:

- 13. I sincerely trust that the above amount will be collected as seen as possible by the COP (Natal). The only method by which this amount could be collected is by a group being appointed to go out with a collection list. In my opinion it should not be left to the different organisations to collect the money separately. As far as the NIC is concerned I am certain that it could not help in any way to liquidate this debt. They are themselves in debt up to over £2000 and quite a big amount was spent by them in connection with the COP.
- 14. The 30 pounds owing to lorry owners ^{AND THE LOAN FROM ANC MEMBERS (5)} is most urgently required and I suggest that some member of the COP undertakes to obtain a loan of ^{£30} ~~£15~~ by tomorrow so that this together with the cash on hand could be utilised to pay off these accounts.

15. We have been just informed that a further loan of £15 was taken from PATEL to send 4 ANC delegates by Train as they were left behind as they were arrested for pass laws.

Therefore, ~~the~~ total amount owing is £102 —.
