Affairs Committee of the Kimberley City Council, said yesterday he could not comment on esolutions taken by his committee to employ Mr. lobert Sobukwe, who was recently released from ben Island, in the municipal Department of

antu Administration.

He said he was unaware that is information was published in an Afrikaan, newspaper which circulates in Kamberley.

It was reported that the committee had decided to employ Mr. Sobukwe as a clerk in the Department of Bantu Administration at a salary of P.600 a year, with a maximum annual salary of R900.

Mr. Venter said: "I can say nothing in this regard as the meeting was held in committee. The matter will come before the council at its next monthly meeting."

The report in the newspaper said that the salary scale mentoned could possibly be increased should. Mr. Sobukwe be interested in the position.

It said the salary would not be drawn from money paid by White taxpayers but, as was the case with other officials in the Department of Bantu Administration, would be paid from the invome received on the sale of Bantu beer.

Mr. Sobukwe's wife, Veronica, has joined him in Kimberley. They had been separated for nine years during his detention on Robben Island. Mrs. Sobukwe had been employed as a midwife in a Soweto clinic. Their four couldren are at school in Lesotho.
