MOTIVATION TO EXTEND NATAL ECC FIELDWORKER POSITION FOR A FURTHER SIX MONTHS

As you know, Haydn Osborn's six month contract comes to an end at the end of next month $(30 \ \mathrm{April})$.

We have undertaken an extensive evaluation of the job during the course of two meetings, and after further discussion at our last General Body meeting, resolved to strongly request National for permission and for funding to extend Haydn's contract by a further six months.

Our motivation for this request is as follows :

- 1. As can be seen from Haydn's report (attached) there continues to be a critical need for monitors in the field. Violence in Natal continues at crisis level. Even when it abates, the SADF will play an important role in implementing any peace agreements, and they will need to be monitored in this role.
- 2. In the light of our last National Conference decision that reconstruction & reconciliation are key areas of work for ECC in the future, we continue to believe that employing a fieldworker is the most appropriate way forward for ECC in Natal. It continues to be the most concrete & effective way in which we can contribute towards our goals of working for a just peace & a positive alternative for the future, building nonracialism, countering militarism & contributing towards the process of reconciliation & reconstruction.
- 3. Haydn has been doing an excellent job under often extremely difficult circumstances. There are numerous examples of ways in which he has made a difference for peace on the ground, sometimes at risk to his personal safety. On the basis of his work over the past 5 months we have unqualified confidence in his ability to do the job.
- 4. Haydn has integrated well with the monitors of our fraternal organisations (Black Sash, DP, IDASA, LRC). They support our view that the job should continue & that Haydn is playing a vital role in the monitoring team.

We have tried hard to be honest in our evaluation, and need to

acknowledge a number of weaknesses on the organisation's part :

- 1. As can also be seen in Haydn's report, wearing an ECC `hat' has closed state/security forces doors which may otherwise have been open to a more `neutral' organisation in their eyes. This is a weakness of ours, and Haydn is on the sharp end of it! However this is our history and who we are. We don't have the resources to counter this image and even if we did we're not sure that we would want to. After much discussion we agreed that this `burden' we carry with our name does not out-weigh the benefit of keeping the fieldworker job going.
- 2. We have not given Haydn the support & direction that he has needed. He has, quite understandably, found this demotivating. We have begun to rectify this weakness by forming a small support group for Haydn. This group will be a 'rap group' as well as giving direction, identifying priorities, etc. It will meet with him at least fortnightly. It has already met 3 times this month.
- 3. We have failed to make full use of the information gained by Haydn during the course of his work. We have not analysed & disseminated it widely enough. We have agreed to rectify this by, at least, developing a comprehensive mailing list of key people & organisations to target with regular information & analysis bulletins (if you have any suggestions please let us know). We are just about to get this project off the ground.

Please let us hear your view as soon as possible. It will be only fair to give Haydn as much notice as possible if his contract is not going to be renewed. However, we hope it won't come to that!

SECTION 2 : PRINCIPLES RELATED TO A FUTURE DEFENCE FORCE IN SOUTH AFRICA

INTRO/CONTEXT

- * ECC National Committee suggested the drafting of a paper to reflect ECC thinking on principles related to a future defence force in South Africa.
- * This paper is a draft framework for use in discussion. The questions which follow are intended to facilitate debate.

DRAFT FRAMEWORK

1. NON-RACIALISM

A new defence force must be non-racial in character. However when the creation of a new defence force takes place there can be no semblances of racism with regard to units, structure, or recruitment. The new defence force should be open to all citizens of South Africa.

- should one be talking of non-racialism ? what about minority rights ?
- how are all the different elements of the forces and people that will make up a new defence force be accommodated?
 how will certain units respond to their disbanding? will the Tranvaal highlanders or the June 16 detatchment be happy with disbanding in accord with non-racialism?
 what about recruitment policy?

2. DEFENCE POLICY

- a) The defence forces primary role must be the protection of the territorial integrity of South Africa. The use of the Defence Force in internal operations is unacceptable. Internal security is the responsibility of the police force.
- b) SA should be committed to developing a nuclear free zone in Africa(in accordance with the OAUs position) and the surrounding oceans
- c) SA should adhere to the Geneva conventions relating to the protocol of war and all related internationally accepted aggreements that govern the conduct of warfare
- what about internal security in times of war? when is the defence force entitled to declare war?

3. DEMOCRACY AND THE NEW DF

- a) The new DF should be fully accountable to an all-party parliamentary committee '
- b) Principles of internal democracy should be prioritised with special emphasis on the individual rights of soldiers as embodied in a bill of rights

- c) Soldiers should be entitled to their own political opinions and the right to vote according to their conscience. However in line with maintaining a defence force that will remain accountable to the elected government of the day the influence of party political agendas within the DF must be discouraged through a number of avenues.
- d) No member of the Defence Force should be such a member against his or her will; in the event of universal or partial conscription in times of war provision must be made for conscientious objectors in line with a universally accepted bill of rights.
- how can accountability be ensured with a non-conscripted army? what avenues can be used from a parliament level down to a grass roots level to ensure accountability?

 what defines an official secret and what level of disclosure should the public be entitled to?

4. FURTHER ISSUES

- a) what type of army is desireable in South Africa ? A professional army or an army based largely on peoples malitias ?
- b) should the army be the only agency with military capacity? What type of firarms policy should exist with regard to civilians and their right to defend themselves?


