Dear Pixie,

Your letter of June 9 just received. I send you the following comments in reply to your questions:-

- (a) I would support any amount of assistance to St. Peter's School, and I think the question of whether you assist them further is best decided by the Trustees themselves.
- (c) I shall try to contact Archbishop Hurley and see if I can secure information as to their needs and then shall send you advice as to priorities.
- (d) My latest information in regard to Adam's College is that the College is determined to continue and determined that it will not shut down voluntarily. I strongly recommend any help to Adam's College.
- (e) I am going to try to discover for you whether any non-European Churches need assistance for their schools.
- (f) The Trustees must decide whether Wilgespruit comes within the terms of the Deed, but if you find that it does, I strongly recommend a grant to the Community.

I wish I could suggest the proportions in which you should allocate funds. It is almost impossible to do this unless we know what the demands are.

You can regard this as an interim reply to your letter because I am anxious to get it off. I am also anxious to do anything that I can to assist you, but feel that I am not an authority on some of the matters that you raise. I shall be writing you a personal letter in the course of a few days and must apologise for my silence. We have been extraordinarily busy of late - not writing books, I'm afraid - but attending meetings, speaking, etc.

In the meantime all best wishes for the Appeal.
