The Bishop raved up in the morning  
to give his greetings & to suggest  
visiting Holy Cross on Sunday. His  
offer of a Confirmation that day

was refused on account of the Chaplain's absence.

Room with the Ladies & the Chaplain &

Mother.

S. Rosemary took baby John to Hospital in the morning & he died there about 5 p.m. General holiday on account of "Poznań University"; so telephoning difficult.

Sat. 11<sup>th</sup>.

7.15 Mass of our Lady. S. Rosemary went into Poznań in the Dodge to arrange about the funeral & fetch Baby John's body from the Hospital. Two of the Boys went to the cemetery & dug the grave there in the morning. Funeral at 2.0. S. Rosemary & Aletta drove down with the Chaplain.

The new Ciborium came in the morning. Mother, S. A. Choda, S. Jind, S. M. Comebi & S. Kayrie drove to the D. S. G. for their sale, & returned just after 6.0 in time to say Vespers before Evensong.

Miss Hartley called & saw Mother & S. Rosemary.

Some good heavy rain <sup>overnight</sup> & <sup>in</sup> early; & again in the evening.
