BANISHMENTS

POINTS WHICH CALL FOR CLARIFICATION.

- 1) How many people are at present restricted under removal orders made under Section 5 of the Native Administration Act, and who and where are these people? (It would be a great help if we knew their postal addresses you suggested that a supplementary question might elicit these.)
- 2) How many people were banished in 1960-61, and who were they?

 What were the reasons for banishment in each case? (This might throw some interesting light on the position in Pondoland. At least two Pondos are reported to have been banished, Chief Mhlabuvelile and Mr. Anderson Kumani Ganyile, a former Fort Hare student. See Sunday Times of 27 November and Contact of 19 December, 1960.)
- 3) How many people have died in banishment since 1948, and who were they? What was the cause of death and date of death in each case?
- 4) How many banishment orders have been lifted in the period 1948-61, and who are the people concerned? On what conditions were the orders lifted?
- 5) How many banishment orders have been suspended (as opposed to permanently lifted) and who were the people concerned? What happens when the period of suspension expires: is the order then lifted if the person concerned has not offended the Government in that period, or is the period of suspension merely a temporary "favour"?
- 6) How many Africans have been banished by local authorities under Section 29 (bis) of the Natives (Urban Areas) Consolidation Act; who are they, where are they, etc.

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
