Herein Please find the report of your Council of Action which has already been given by me at the last meeting of your working Committee, as Follows:-That the Secretary of the Council of Action be directed by the President-General in his capacity as Chairman of the Council to call upon all members of the African National Congress at present serving in the Natives! Representative Council to resign forthwith and that other members loyad to the course of Africa resign not later than two months after and that further the same Secretary name forthwith the body of the Natives: Representative Council as a body for Collaboration with the Government. That a conference be held at JOHANN SBURG between the Council of Action and members of the House of Assembly, the Senate and the Provicial Councils representing the Africans in pursuance of the Council's resolution of the 4th March 1950. That the 7th day of April 1952 be declared a day of mourning by the President-General, as in the manner of clause ONE, and that other non-European bodies be informed to consider and take their positions in same. That Sunday the 24th June 1951 be observed by arranging mass meeting through out South Africa, and Independence Pleadge be read in every meeting to keep the 26th June a National Day. Indepe-ndence Pleage. We the African People, concious as we are of the inherent and inalienble rights of Nations to determine their own destiny; and recognising that where these sacred principles are denied or in any manner proscribed the people have a natural prerogative, and are in duty bound, to overthrow such forces as tend towards the unreasonable limitation of their divine rights; and being painfully aware that the present structure of society in this sub- continent is constructed so as to deny to the vast masses of the people the full amd unfettered power of self-expression and self-realisation which is the heritage of all humanity, DO HEREBY PLEDGE OURSELVES to Wage anxiounrelenting struggle till complete political independents be achieved; at which time there can be called and organised a constituent Assembly chosen by and representative of the whole population of Southren Africa, irrespective of race, sex, coul-our or cread to lay the basis for the setting up of true people's Democratic Republic and the of a creative Africanist society in which the ideal of man's humanity to man will guide human activity".

5. That in pursuance of the Progarame of Action and the last report to Conference, campaign for civil disobedience inaugurated as Follows:-

- (a) -very Branch of the African Congress be required, in the aforegoing manner, to contribute as much as possible leader of both sexes who shall volunteer for Action in civil disobedince. That this volunteers shall be called out, inafore going manner, one month before Action so as to recieve a period of traning. That the IRBE list of volunteers be closed on the 1st day of June 1951. That on the 1st day of July, 1951. Training starts. That action be gone into as an from the 1st day of August, 1951.
- (b) That an official or member of the Council of Action be vested with powers of commanding and Training the disobeyers under the designation of NAXX "PARAMOUNT LEAD-R OF CIVIL DISOBEDI--NCE".
- (c) That "P.L.C.D." be MR. GAUR RADEB ..
- (d) That the "P.L.C.D.". Present to the Council of Action for approval or other wise a plan for organisation, command and Training, of the disobeyers.
- (e) A form to be prepared by the Secretary General for the Purpose of effecting cluase (a) hereof. Further that the Secretary-General find a farm and tentto accommodate the Trainees.
- (f) That all the committees carrying out the programme of Action be called upon by the Council of Action to Submit their memorits to the Council not later than the 31st of March, 1951 and thereafter quarterly. Further that a strong letter be be sent from the Council to the heads of these committees.
- (g) That announcement of these plans be made immediately after the approval by the National Executive Committee.
