Dearest Hob.

How are you? You must be feeling a lot happier now that Veronica is with you. Has she definitely got a job? And how does the salary compare with what she was getting in Johannesburg?

I could not get Dr Wynberg onto the Saturday flight that I wrote about in my last letter. Instead, he will be arriving in Kimborley at 8.40 am (still on Saturday, June 38). We should, therefore, be with you at your home shortly after 9 am. OK? If I don't hear from Nr Meyer within the next couple of days I'll put through a call to him to check about Dr Wynberg's permit which I have asked for.

I had a letter yesterday from Sister Stephanie in Lebothe, acking when Hiliswa would be hearing from the pen friends I promined. I was cross with myself for having furgions forgetten to ank the children, Dini and Milisum, about this when I saw them in Kimberley. Can you ask them whether they have had any pen friend letters yet? Friends of mine in the USA, UK and Israel said they would arrange pen friends for both of them.

With Claudio due, I hope, sometime this week, I feel very much as though I am living in suspense. I am so looking forward to her coming, and an very hopeful indeed that things will work out well between us. I liked your description of her as a "natural" person. You really caught her spirit well. She has written to her father to tell him that she is returning and that she and I are much involved. As a result, he phoned me the other day to voice his strongest objections! Said he would disinherit her? I measured him I couldn't care less whether she had any money or not, and he seemed to accept this. Extraordinary. Anyway, we had a long talk in which he told me exactly how little he thinks of my politics and activities, thanked me for discussing things so rationally and calmly with him -- and ansured me that he had not changed his view about me. I hope the wretched man isn't going to try to cause any trouble. There's enough of it around the place as it is.

Meanwhile, just to add to the excitement, I had a long fone call from Norms in London on Friday night. She mants a reconciliation. I said no, not interested. I told her how I had tried to explain our relationship to you, and that when I came to last year you had goggled at me with amazement and had looked at me though I was mad (you did, you know?). And that it had sounded outrageous even to my ears so I had dropped the subject.

I've just thought: if Zodwa looks at this letter, woman-like she's going to have lots to may!

It's been a masty week politically, hasn't it? The Leakee inquest, with the shutter coming down hard, and the BOSS Bill..... Did you see also that small report about Belen asking a question about the Egoathe death in jail and the Winister solomnly Jacking that the question stand over, with the Wats laughing away because they know this meant it would not be raised again until next year with Parliament ending? I found it chilling. But then I tend to find a lot of things chilling these days, even with all my cyniciam.
