

(c) General National Economy: Further, and generally, the African National Congress aims at a national economy which will:-

- (i) Embrace all peoples and groups within the State.
- (ii) Eliminate discrimination and injustices and ensure a just and equitable distribution of the national wealth among the people.
- (iii) Give all men and women an equal chance to improve their lot.
- (iv) Eliminate the basis of racial or national superiority and domination, in other words, to adopt such measures as will eradicate and remove racial or national privileges and favouritism.

4. EDUCATIONAL POLICY:

- (a) The ultimate goal of the African National Congress in so far as education is concerned is a 100% literacy among the people, in order to ensure the realisation of an effective democracy. Some of the means to that end are:-
 - (i) Free compulsory education to all children up to the age of eighteen.
 - (ii) Adequate training facilities, proper accommodation for children in all schools and colleges. All teachers to be paid salaries which are sufficient for them to maintain their dignity and self-respect.
 - (iii) Mass adult education by means of night schools, adult classes, summer and winter schools.
- (b) All persons to have a sound general education, and to have access to the type of education that they are suited for. They are to have access to aesthetic, vocational and technical training.
- (c) The Congress stands for the policy of assimilating the best elements in other civilisations and cultures into the firm basis of what is good and durable in the African's own culture. In this way Africa will be in a position to make her own special contribution to human progress in modern times.
- (d) The Congress supports the cultural struggle of the African people in all categories, and encourages all works and efforts by African artists, and stands for a co-ordinated development of African cultural activity.
