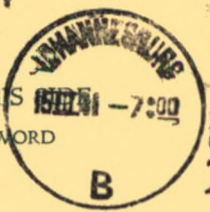

Dear Kenneth, Proposed Separate Scout Association  
for Coloured Boys.

As you will remember there have been discussions for some time in the Headquarters Council of the Pathfinder Boy Scout Association regarding the desirability or otherwise of having a separate organisation for Coloured boys. At the last meeting of the Council held in Johannesburg on December 16th 1940, it was decided to inform the Western Province Divisional Pathfinder Scout Council (which had raised the matter) that no objection would be taken by the Scout Council to the establishment of a separate Coloured branch, & I was authorised to give such help as might be desired.

I now enclose a draft circular which I propose, after consultation with the Pathfinder Scout Divisional Commissioner for the Western Province (Mr. J. J. Fock), to send out to ~~the~~ call the conference.

I shall be glad to know that there is no objection on the part of your Council to the action now proposed. You will remember that it was clearly understood, ~~that~~ when the Pathfinder Scout Branch was formed, that there would be no opposition to the Coloured troops being hired off in due course.

Will you please try to let me have an early reply.
