Slowly & steadily animosity, fuelled by impatience at JS part. Growing from early differences over emergence, and total abrasions of K's role in allegedly obstructing formation of relations between CP + ANC. JS very strong in need for open, formal alliance, K apparently prepared to let sleeping dogs lie. Note: K's bad temper, rudeness to JS, - JS claim deliberate falsehoods etc - symptomatic of exactly my own behaviour patterns, intolerance, short temper etc. in run up to my heart attack.

1960/63.

It was like a ship with a leak, slowly going down, but with its crew staying in their places, the band playing, stiff upper lips, while an actual processional took to the boats. Who did it start? With the house arrests. At the Hodgesons after who's in the flat. Then one by one Kotane, Hamel, Marks. (Dakos had left in 1960 anyway. We had got used to life without him). But now the canaries were on, Kotane house arrested; Hamel ?? to maintain AC which could no longer carry on; Marks?? Slowly & Op. Mayibuye. Cape Town. The bunting preparing to leave as soon as possible came through ?? reasons. And then the break went wild. Mandela already in jail; Sisulu. Mkhoni house arrested; Raymond abroad for training with others - Wilton, Mbembe?; Ruth had gone in 1960? So how; Sisonke to Zimbabwe. Who?? Began to feel I was the only survivor with my head above water - except lesser luminaries - with Braam. Kathy also went to Rivonia? reason?? And still the ship sank while we carried on.

It was in the best & worst tradition of the party - as exemplified by 1950 lead up to Supp. Act. Look at the practical tasks above all else - leave the theoretical future to the future. It was magnificent - no panic, total dedication to a cause, almost no defectors. And yet suicidal! Has this ever been discussed. The lessons learnt? I do not know. Post Rivonia I missed 1½ years of contact, & emerged half blinded to a new continent and a new consciousness about me. - And so, to operation Mayibuye & the raid at Rivonia.

NEW PARTY. The Suppression Act, the first listing & the need to reply to the Legumates. Again, a great gesture, but was it right, or suicidal? What is the Justice verdict.

And so, the committee to consult with 'leaders', to draft the reply; which became upon facts the starting point for a new party. Consultations with Edwin & Dr. Plessis; Wolpaar, Cape Town & Sisonke; Durban. Marks in the odd, again farcical, arrangement, & so to new set of principles of SACP, a final conference.

Note: moves by students JS school (all white?). run in parallel with the above. ? What does Edwin claim to have done - see interview with US writer as described below Long Tom Lodge.

Prop. con.  
1940/43??

Call for volunteers to work circa 1941 - my work on Propcon: 2nd front campaign = offices in 207 St. Job's Hall for 1st ever (since 1920s) white only CP mass meeting. Also pamphlets in wartime - 'Am the People' and mass sales widely under way at Zoo Lake V for Victory fete. Was this a wrong emphasis, putting our work particularly on European side? But an African/Indian side emphasis on Passes - another pamphlet even when Steyn began to move - and especially on African TVs rather than national liberation. See pamphlet 'How to get more mass,' and mass influx into habeous, & main building going on everywhere - e.g. Castle Breweries & Tshwane TSHALKE.

PARTY / 1944?

Party Conference ? 1944? with Sisoni's report on war. G. C. Woodley looking to inside Nazi Party for resolution. The discussion on removal of CC to Cape Town. legis., & compromise about 1 year's work for MTB & AL in Cape Town. Some time hereafter, I am elected Dist. Secretary - prior to joining the army after 2nd front campaign is won - front general. Period of great expansion, & broadening out of CP - national fractions as e.g. Greeks - Yugoslavia; Springfield Legion; Theatre group, lawyers group etc. But in retrospect, the nat. TVs front underestimated because it was not active enough - the TVs seemed to be front runners; regularly speaking at location meetings with TUs, especially on Sundays. City Hall fete for funds etc.

POST. WAR.

The sh fight Malan in July while I was still in army. But generally, I think we underestimated Nat revival despite this worry, probably because of our own isolation from platteland. SL began concentrating on retaking the VP - we tried to the TUS/CP's 'We for All' Campaign, with Julian Cope, TVs, ANC? In the euphoria of black advance - see e.g. VE day march through Johannesburg, unprecedented - schizophrenia with the party fraction concentrating on blacks, SL on whites? The nat victory failed us unprepared.

Note: This strike of 1946! as one of main formative experiences in the modern movement.

ANC/CP.

Relations as discussed at that time, e.g. NEC decisions, emergence of Party had both a negative and a positive effect. Negative was leading, exemplified by Dadoo, to allow the CP to be dictated to by needs & policies of ANC, which prevented the emergence of a real CP presence in the camps and at HQ in the 1960s. The gradual shift from this predominantly Mkhondane influence in the later 1960s also provided the propaganda basis for the gang of eight's result - not an actual cause, but a post facto excuse. Also as consequence an almost all white CP leadership in London, an all black leadership in Africa, with policies conflicting more & more in practice until the partial resolution of problem at Morogoro.

COD. etc.

The existence of COD led to student association of multi-racial 'axis', over the state of consciousness & sensitivities of ANC generally, a world in

part at least be regarded as negative in general course of the movement. Great sensitivity needed by whites, on the other hand, also led to an unritical and worshipful attitude to ANC & black struggle generally. Blunting the critical faculties of the most advanced elements in the CP and elsewhere, and covering over of ANC's political and administrative deficiencies. For these reasons, our movement which has produced a large & varied body of propaganda & literature, has produced a very small body of critical political appraisal, or even academic inquiry into history, economics, institutions of SA etc.

C8. LP/CPIOS. Participation in LP & LLY predisposes to a concentration of the white political scene, and the 'native problem' as a sideline. To what extent did this traditional continue into the whole war period? It is surely of some relevance, significance, that the demise of the LP and later of the SL opened the way for a turn of the more active white wing towards the national liberation movement. Until that time, the CP concentration on the black majority was reflected mainly - not entirely - in its concentration on the TU movement. So much so, that during the most receptive years for CP propaganda, the war years 1943 on, our party recruitment was on a mass trade union economic basis c.f. Castle Breweries conference in 1943, vast extension of general unions, mass recruitment at Market Square, CP pamphlet 'How to get more money' etc.

'But' note extensive propaganda/education developed, especially night schools and their contribution to the growth of an advanced urban working class sector.

DETENTION

✓ Note: decision in Pretoria 1960 to refuse to be interrogated. a collective decision, & its success. An important lesson for future resistance - especially, our attitude to 'silence' after arrest at a late stage.

CHILDHOOD.

Memory of family 'Henneberry' - also biggeman champion of this of anti-pass campaign - sketchy of Nkosi.

Other symbolism: The defense conduct of case + upholding the law - tradition. The prosecutor its corruptor!

Milan Kundera: "The struggle of man against power is the struggle of memory against forgetting."

The court is strongly isolated from the outside world - almost unrelated to it. We are like ~~shadows~~ in a play which goes on from night to night according to the script regardless of the turmoil in the streets outside. This isolation has been prepared - laid on by go days. Bram never speaks of what he is doing outside. We never ask!

There is the world. And there is the court!

Are we like a crew in a canoe - sleeping to deep quarters by night, huddled together in a single hazardous enterprise by day?

? Does the country watch & draw lessons from our performances in court? Or are we actors as in rehearsal, for ourselves? And perhaps the outside world which we know is watching. (like TV actors removed from their audience?)

Courts often portrayed as heroic struggles of prosecution vs defense, crime vs punishment! The whole process is a demeaning one. One sees oneself as engaged in a struggle of ideas, of philosophies, of titanic proportions - freedom vs tyranny; individual rights vs. state. And here in court is reduced to this degrading hucksterism of Yotam, colonial witnesses, petty lies and denials. There is nothing noble about all this - except perhaps in Nelson's speech, and the constant refusal of accused to go along with the slime!

We are not heroes, only defenders of our own past and our own faith. We are survivors, witnesses to another moral/ethical/political code perhaps.

Why do we go along with false evidence rather than challenge it? Is truth not a value in itself? If truth is unimportant why? What is important?

Does clear conscience account for the survival of all of us (Grimy excluded?)

### APPROACH TO LIFE IS:

1. ~~This~~ This is a watershed in the history of our struggle. We know it. It is in this light that we shape our defense. It is a continuation of war. We will save what we can of our forces, give them the understanding & morale to spring back again after defeat. Consequence: precise truth of all allegations is almost irrelevant; it is historic truth, political truth that is at stake.
2. Prosecutor also here seen this as watershed in pointers. They are going for victory, no holds barred. Far from too in different way. truth ethics, law no longer operates. Victory is all. Hence Yotam's attitude of obstruction & defense - consultation twice and keeping track of consultations, piling obstructions over incidents etc. Monologue in court. Reading of documents for pros. And above all lies! Manufactured. Skilful hard to detect lies. lying as an art form. Smear of Butcher, Bram etc. Ready witnesses.
3. ~~Defects~~ culprits - into impulsive, allows cruelty, stuporously. He commits at Yotam's facts.
4. Between when they have corrupted, raped, the SA justice system - with long term consequences.
5. Why do we not notice it when we are in court - why no demagogia?

Perhaps because we are too close — see ortho details, St grand design.  
And so lies pass unchallenged except where relevant to HAW w/o WTR!

longer to persuade myself to move. For years I have been making things happen. No more. I am now just waiting for this to happen to me. The tormentor!

SACTU:

General weakness about looking back historically shows itself here more than anywhere. To what extent has our continuing adherence to a SACP myth aided our indifference & absence from the real world of organizing SA workers in a period of industrial growth, which could do way for the supremacy of the 'workerist' tendency. Even now, in a more volatile age, is SACTU alliance with us not exactly a real alliance with the TV movement while in the long run is the effective vehicle of 'working class leadership' in the struggle?

CP. 1964 on. Note on my arrival in GB attempt to report & reopen errors of the past in particular underestimation of the Eng's reaction to violence. Given built off by leadership not given to looking back. E.g. was 'Op Mayibuye' ever reconsidered, or just buried under table. Similarly 1969/70 decision to vest in leadership to full term. Was it ever reviewed? On this decision my own opposition tempered by desire not to advance my own interests - also since proposal was sprung on me - did not consider e.g. who were full trustees? who appointed or selected them. - on what basis? e.g. Tass, SACTU etc. some verbal self appointees.

On similar basis - decision to have 2 tie-members in board for 'secret' - na. secret war. - request for all members to certify willingness to return to SA - was it ever re-considered? What of its effect? And was this a satisfactory style of leadership or of cadre selection, or was it a continuation of prioritizing consensus at one end of membership, and arbitrariness at other without democratic safeguards.

CPSA. 1942? Campaign of propaganda for 2nd front to be opened. Effigies hung in Eng St. followed by City Hall meeting of white!

C3. 1959/60 And C.S. Ramdhunes, ~~longing~~ duplicating & being paper to convene meetings of ANC.

ON CP/ANC. Attitudes to join ANC from e.g. Solly Maniatse of God-Loy Umali et al. Echlin's attitudes to ANC at time of formation of independent party. Debate at Party Conference? '47?? on decision to NRC etc - Sutliff view that we can ignore ANC.

C4. Deal with Torch Commando, formation, and illusions of the 'Mark on Parliament.'

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
