PRESIDENTIAL REPORT SEASON 1982/1983

Today is the Second year that I took office - I cannot say it has been an easy task, but it has been very fruitful for the Board. At times there were sleepless nights, but as always obstacles are in our way, some satisfactory and others not satisfactory, yet we overcome all the difficulties.

As changes occur in the affairs and conditions of the Board, which we created with the Blessings of the South African Cricket Board, we either wither away because they become irrevelant, or, they grow stronger because we are able to adapt to strange and difficult circumstances and become more relevant in enabling to cope with change.

Over the past six years changes have occurred in the Board which imposed strains on the existing structure, and the weight and burden of these changes have been directed towards the Officials and fellow Delegates and Cricketers. During this period of time the Board has not withered but has become more adaptive or relevant and more powerful. We have changed our style, flexed our muscles and homed our objectives until the stage where we are a force to be reckoned with in the Transvaal, more fully capable of controlling change and less prepared to sit back and allow or accept conditions being imposed on us by others.

The year just passed was possible a milestone in the development of this Board and was a year of high activity for us.

The most exceptional change that occurred last year in our affairs was the amount of Cricket played - at provincial and club level, for the first time we were able to put our Administration and our dealings with our officials and cricketers, and indeed, the co-ordination of our activities, on a basis where we were dealing with capably and efficiently with all our affairs. It has been a year of high activity for the Board. I think it is probable that few organisations will have engendered as much enthusiasm and as much dedication and involvement, as we have done.

This has been really a spectecular year for the Board's activities as we also saw a function at the end of the season which reached a very high level of professionalism and aspiration and perhaps the most significant of the function was that we made it for the season 1982/1983 on the theme "The Year of the Kill."

A very important activity that culminated was the effects of the Constitution Committee of this Board, and I believe that the time which had been spent on this was probably worth taking, and I would like to bring a special word of thanks to them for the work they put into the Amended Constitution which has now finally seen the light today and I believe is an improved document in terms of its wording and the general tightness in which it approaches our affairs. This is highly significant.

I think that if we had stopped at this point and we had only discussed the role we play in furthering the aim, the objectives in bettering the environment of those who play with us, it would have been a commendable year.

We made great strides, however, on what I might term a more political front and this is an activity which goes very much in keeping with my earlier remarks about our Board adapting to our times and being more aware of its role, not only the watchdog of the cricket scene, but we should beleive that we are the watchdog of the Political scene as well.

We have also strengthened our links with the South African Cricket Board as a result of me becoming the Secretary of the Board for which special thanks to the Board for allowing me to be your delegate at the meetings of the South African Cricket Board. The message has been taken to far corners in the Transvaal about how we see our situation and where we stand, and I beleive that this may in itself have provided the catalyst for enthusiastic following and I am quite sure that we have seen nothing yet of what may follow if each of us responsibly discharge our role in carrying forward the whole concept, the whole vision we have in front of us.

Our membership has shown that we have increased and they have all involved themselves in that we see in all that we do. Today our membership stands higher than it ever had in the history of Transvaal Cricket and yet I would put it to you that we are short of the target that we have set ourselves, that is to win the hearts of all Non-Racial Cricketers. It needs a great deal of application and involvement by all of us and an understanding that it is an important task and objective we can set ourselves if we are going to achieve the wider objectives that we have set.

Motivation is a very important part of our Board, therefore, to be and to do and dare, to keep on keeping on, is one of the highest human qualities and one of the most rewarding for the Board,

With courage we can do almost anything for the Board, without it, we will not do much and will lack the fire that there is and the dynamic drive to win through for the ultimate:

"Normal Sports in a Normal Non-Racial Society."

During the period of time since the formation of this Board the entire structure of our finances were not good at all and last year we looked at it very carefully. It was felt that our financial position should be better in the year 1982/1983 season and was absolutely essential for its success, and to do this, we had to do what we did and that was the Raffle of the BMW Car as first prize, a trip for two to Mauritius as second prize, a Video Machine as a third prize. When you see the reports of the Financial Statement which will be put in front of you and the progress made during the year, you will agree that our Board is today on a very stable and on a very sound financial footing.

I want to take the opportunity of thanking, not only the people on the Executive, but every one of the Delegates and Cricketers of the Board who have been of esteemable help during the season. We could not go forward in the way that we have, and at the speed that we have without having positive input from very, very good people.

Like all Cricketing bodies, the strength of any organisations is the strength of its people, an I beleive today that this Board consists of the best people in the Transvaal.

I want to put it to you in Conclusion, that what we are working for is not that wielding of political strength. We are not working towards establishing and manipulating the Board for our own end. It is my belief that what we are doing, is looking forward to a day when we shall operate in an environment of high integrity, high morality, an era where there will be a very clear sense of the need of one for the other, because there never can be a time in our Board, (I think previous events has shown this) when one part of our Board can benefit at the expense of the other.

Neither can there ever be a situation where we as a Board can benefit at the expense of the public. We look forward to shedding completely and justifying our very positive role in the society of our country on a NON-RACIAL basis.

As for this coming season 1983/1984, we are not going to look back but move ahead with one thought, that is

SECRETARIAL REPORT - 1982/3.

Mr President, Delegates and Members.

I have pleasure in submitting this Report on the activities of the Transvaal Cricket

Board for the season 1982/3 for your consideration.

l am taking this opportunity to pay tribute to the late Sheik M.G. Booley whose services to non - racial cricket, climaxing in his success in securing the Benson and Hedges sponsorship, will forever be cherished by us but we will be doing a disservice to the memory of so dedicated a leader if we do not work doubly hard to realise our and Sheik Booley's ideals. The Booley Trophy will serve as a lasting tribute to his outstanding services to non - racial cricket.

The tragic death of Mr. M. Senokoanyane of A.S.A.S.A. and Mr.I.C. Bassa of S.A.T.T.B. has robbed us of outstanding administrators and will be sorely missed by one and all.

1. ADMINISTRATION AND MEETINGS

Circularisation of minutes is one important aspect which needs immediate attention. It will not only decrease the duration of meetings but clubs will be placed in a position to mandate their delegates on all matters. Clubs missing meeting will also be in a position to keep abreast of decisions taken at that particular meeting. Also no correspondence must be entertained if not submitted on that clubs letterhead. Great care must be taken, not to pass resolutions which if enforced will only detrimentally affect the board instead of having its desired effect. Certain clubs did not attend a fair number of meetings. It showed up their lack of commitment to the Board but on top of it accused the Board of taking decisions without their consent. Imposing fines maybe part of the answer because commitment cannot be bought, it can only be emphasised.

Overall the work was well handled by the officials and the Board functioned reasonably well.

2. LEAGUE CRICKET.

My congratulations to Grescent C C for being Super League champions and also to Lenz Utd. C.C. for winning the Ist division, Ottomans C.C. for winning the 2nd division and Sheffield C.C. for winning the 3rd division. While the four separate divisions created immense healthy and much needed competitioness it also brought about an ugly phenomenon - "Win at all costs". Sportsmanship took a back seat but more damaging, it imbibed in our juniors the same attitude which became prevalent at their end of the season knock-out competition. I do not profess to have a ready made solution but I can suggest that stern control and action by team captains will go a long way in restoring the "gentlemans game" the dignity it deserves. The standard of cricket showed a marked improvement but I must once again emphasise that cricket will only improve to the extent that one decicates oneself in improving batting and bowling basic skills and techniques. The lack of coaches makes this dedication imperative.

3. HOWA BOWL.

We finished runners up to Western Province for the second year in succession but why couldn't we have emerged winners? Simply because our players do not gear themselves to keep control of the game throughout the three days. Lapses at crucial moments saw certain games slip through our fingers.

In standard of play was reasonable although no player scored a century, a feat which has

not been achieved since the inception of the Board.

In order to prepare for the inter - provincial games I would like the Board to appoint a manager, captain and couch at the First Council Meeting for the whole season, who together with a squad of players, will meet regularly throughout the season. From now till then squad physical training shoud be organised. During the off-season players must partake in other sports, especially hockey which has recently been resusitated.

4. BOOLEY TROPHY.

The disturbing aspect of this competition was that no young player of exceptional ability emerged who can be groomed for the senior side. Part of the blame can be attributed to the fact that teams selected for this competition did not practice and meet regularly. My suggestion i.r.o. the senior team must be extended to the "B" team. In addition to the "Sportsman of the Year" which Dr.R.Gopal deservingly won, an award i.r.o. "Provincial Player of the Year" for each of the two competitions would provide the provincial players with an incentive to do well.

5. BENSON AND HEDGES CUP.

My heartiest congratulations to our "B" team for reaching the semi-finals and seeing that it is our first venture into one day cricket. I am sure we will do much better this season. The inclusion of W. Transvaal gave more players the opportunity to play. Finally our thanks to the United Tobacco Company for their sponsorship.

6. JUNIOR CRICKET.

The lack of parental involvement has meant that the burden of organising is left entirely in the hands of a few individuals who can do so much and no more. Therefore it has become important that ways and means be sought to encourage parental involvement. If the Barclays Bank Coaching Scheme become a reality it will dramatically change the expectations of the junior crickets. Without the sponsorship the Board will have to step in which will then become its first priority for the 1983/4.

7. UMPIRING.

Each team must appoint an umpire who will then be co-ordinated into an Umpires Union who will then organise classes where umpiring lesson will be introduced.

8. S.A. CRICKET BOARD.

The S.A.CB. gained an extra affiliate at its recent A.G.M. They are Komani and District Cricket Union who hail from the Queenstown area which brings the number of S.A.C.B. affiliates to 11. The total number of senior players showed an improvement compared to the previous season and this fact is very heartening.

The Board attended all S.A.C.B. meetings and is destined to play a very important role with the appointment of Mr. A.Mangera as its Secretary. My congratulations to him and we promese you all our co-operation and assistance to make your Secretarialship a very efficient one indeed.

At the moment each registered member is liable an amount of R1.75 made up as follows. Registration R0.50, S.A.C.O.S. levy R0.25 and S.A.C.B. levy R1.00. I would suggest that R0.50 be added for International Affairs to cover travelling, accommodation and printing cost related thereto.

9. SPONSORSHIP.

Attempts at securing sponsorship have so far proved unsuccessful and the chances seem remote. But an intensive effort was not made during the season and therefore unexplored avenues must be investigated during the coming season.

Although our fund raising effort was worthwhile it would have been an outstanding success had all the clubs sacrificed a little time and made an effort to sell the raffle tickets. Some clubs proved such ventures can be a success whilst others made no effort at all. But a very important lesson must be learnt from this venture. Only a venture wherein ALL the clubs can guarantee 100% participation must be undertaken. This will eliminate all sorts of excuses why clubs could not do this, that or the other.

10. INTERNATIONAL CRICKET CONFERENCE.

The S.A.C.U. has claimed that they are non-racial. But the four separate education systems will always be a constant reminder that racialism in S.A. is rife and legalised by acts of Parliament. They have not come out clearly in favour of the removal of discriminatory legislation from the statute books and in a nutshell believed that cricket can be isolated and compartmentalised within the broader apartheid structure of S.A. society. Heaven help him if the West Indians decide to swim in Durban!

We are committed in the formation of a single non-racial controlling body for all in a non-racial S.A. International acceptance of S.A.C.U. and the resumption of cricket ties would remove a vital element in this historical task, and severely impede the process of the unification of all cricketers. The present situation is that some member countries of the I.C.C. would only be allowed to come to S.A. as "Honorary Whites". The S.A.C.U. is prepared to accept such a situation.

Rebel tours will come and go but the players coming will be in the "over the hill"calibre and will NEVER replace the test match status as played all over the world. The novelty will wither and S.A.C.U. will be back to square one.

11. GROUNDS.

Is the Lenasia Stadium owned by the Johannesburg City Council and administered by the JHB. Cricket Council, which for all intents and purposes stop functioning 3 years ago when most of the office bearers became part of the Transvall Cricket Council? But it appears that JHB. Cricket Council is "alive" and "well" so who do they represent?

Without an enclosed ground to host inter - provincial fixtures the JHB. City Council must be approached to clear the air.

12. UNITY.

The past year has seen calls from sports, political, community and youth organisations aimed at <u>UNITING</u> the oppressed in their struggle for a non-racial society. But how much unity exists within the Board? A great deal would be my answer, but not enough freedom of speech, the right to a contrary opinion, equality between official and delegate are fundamental to a democratic system. But it does not mean that if a disagreement arises it should lead to disunity. No. A majority decision must be accepted and those opposed must assist shoulder to shoulder to carry out such a decision. Otherwise the Board will not make progress it should be making.

13. SUN CITY.

The venue has become the mecca of foreign sportspersons sanction busting tours and therefore is in direct contravention of one of our policies: discouraging sportspersons from touring to and from S.A. I do not suggest that the Board takes a formal decision whether Sun City is acceptable or not but generate discussion so that a consensus of opinion can become apparent.

14. MEDIA.

Iwould suggest the following guidelines if we are invited to appear on radio or T.V.:

1. The programme be transmitted live and not recorded and transmitted later so that it could be edited.

2. How much publicity will we gain from accepting such an invitation.

3. Prevent giving nonentities credibility.

4. The radio and T.V. stations are not based on racial lines.

Strict adherence to the guidelines may prove to be counter-productive at certain times and therefore they should be treated as such.

15. OPPORTUNISTS.

I would prefer a player who is not committed to the aims and objectives of the Board playing elsewhere then looking for the slightest excuse to defect from our ranks. These opportunists must be exposed because at times they deliberately do more harm than good to our cause and Board. And as for those who use racialism as an excuse to hide or cover up their inefficiences Iboldly tell them: search your conscience.

16. COLOURS.

I hope that we will be able to present ties to our Provincial Players and that steps be taken to finalise the style of the tie.

Also, if acceptable, print stickers with the words "Promote non-racial cricket - Propagate non-racialism - Transvaal cricket Board". It will not only promote our name but will generate discussion in areas where the Board is not a household name.

17. GROUNDS COMMITTEE.

The function of such a committee would basically be to report to the officials of the Board, urgent improvements which the grounds they have been entrusted to keep under surveillance needs. The officials then can act swiftly.

18. PRIORITIES.

1. Coaching scheme. 2. Umpire's Union. 3. Sponsorship or fund raising campaigns. 4. Lenasia Stadium.

. Captains and Managers for "A" and "B" provincial teams.

6. Parental involvement in Junior cricket. 7. Circularisation of minutes.

I wish to thank one and all for their contribution which made the past season a very successful one and also my thanks for all the assistance, guidance and co-operation I received.
