- 2) Arising out of this section:
  - a) Is it correct that Yusuf Cachalia visited Standerton?
  - b) Did Dr Motlana address a Defiance Campaign meeting in Standerton?
  - c) Has Mr M'Gwabeni correctly remembered what happened to Prof after the meeting?
- 3) Is it correct that, apart from Prof's Defiance Campaign activity, he had no contact with the ANC or the CYL while he was in Standerton?
- 4) Did he ever go to Johannesburg? If so, when? How did he travel there? Why did he go?
- 5) Did you know him when he first visited Johannesburg -- that is, for the first time in his life? If so, what did he say about his feelings?
- 6) Did he, while in Standerton, have contact with other African nationalists? If so, when, and how was contact maintained?
- 7) My impression is that telephones barely existed in the Standerton location, and travel to Johannesburg and elsewhere was not all that easy. Is this correct? And if so, did this make political contact difficult?
- 8) When did Prof start writing for The Africanist?
- 9) What was the Bureau for African Nationalism in 1952?
- 10) Is it correct that Prof trained Mandrell's senior choir which won a competition at Bethal? Had he shown interest in music before this?
- 11) Did he apply to Wits for a job, or did Wits approach him? If he applied, how did he learn there was a job available?
- 12) Do you know what sort of pass he had?
- 13) Any other information or comments?
