 raised it. - But there are national matters of  
 Education & this 1/3 of £1 tax goes to Central  
 Fund to be administered by Ministers of N.A. for  
 Education - (without taking education from Prov.  
 Councils, no decision on this).  
 The £1 tax made £1,126,000  
 if 15/- - £994,000 - too little to pay  
 Debt to U.G. & develop Education etc.

Local Taxes The money raised from an area is to be spent  
 on that area. The Nland crisis for development - to  
 reserve it for natives - these lands are desired by whites &  
 the only way to reserve is by development.  
 Nland will remain native land because this being  
 developed by natives. That which wants to play still must  
 be forced to develop etc. Hence tax for all. 10% tax  
 £290,000 after paying to existing Councils £150,000  
 £140,000 to be set 50,000% total £1,600,000. £50,000 each less 1/10

Two proposals of 1923 were dropped & instructions issued by the  
Govt that new ones should be drafted with Tax Receipt  
as basis.

This Receipt puts Native tax payers in Town in  
the same position as the White Poll tax payers.

Col. Casswell. Govt desires to open a way for higher wages by the  
abolition. This is not opposed to Black but rather interests. We  
are in an industrial emergency. What has brought the natives  
to town. Not White men digging themselves, but rather they got cheaper  
labour from Natives - recently started.

Indirect Taxation: Each household pays 15% <sup>Good, implements etc</sup> there are 1,000,000  
Active households - £750,000

Provincial Councils do not tax the people in person or property or income - but dogs are still taxed by Provincial & even Divisional Councils. In C.P. 2% is levied on wharftide of resources or location towards Roads. Such tax will be ~~paid~~ annulled by this act. The 2% being now raised from the 10% <sup>local</sup> ~~poll~~ tax. Dipping tax would fall to Local C. They could include it in 10% or not, but this will mean poor men paying for the dipping of rich men's stocks.
