ANNUAL REPORT. 1956.

The work of the Bantu Men's Social Centre during the period under review has gone on smoothly and efficiently, fulfilling the purposes of the Centre's existence in providing wholesome recreational facilities for the African people.

We are indeed deeply indebted, not only to our Founders for having established the Institution, but also to our European friends who made it possible for us to go through another year of useful service.

STAFF:

The Staff of the Centre consists of Secretary, Assistant Secretary and three Cleaners.

The Administrative work of the Centre is the responsibility of the Secretaries who are directly responsible to the Executive Committee.

During the year one of the Cleaners Mr. Louis Moyo left for home on a ten months leave.

Grateful we are indeed to Mr. Johannes Maseko, who is responsible for the training of Boxers and to Mr. Hoses Matlaganyane who is in charge of the Body Building and Weight Lifting Section. Both these men are doing excellent work.

MEMBERSHIP:

The period under review, had a considerable increase in membership, although from year to year the fluctuations in membership have always been a problem to workers.
