CONSTITUTION.

1. NAME. The name of the organisation shall be the African National Congress Youth League ( hereinafter styled the C.Y.L.)

2. AIMS & OBJECTS.

. . .

OBJECTS. The aims and objects of the C.Y.L. shall be

- (a) To arouse and encourage national conciousness and national pride among African Youth.
- (b) To prepare African Youth for responsibility and leadership in the struggle for fre don, democracy and social progress.

- (c) To strive and work for the educational, moral and cultural advancement of African Youth.
- (d) To study the political, economic and social problems of Africa and the World.
- (e) To assist, support, re-inforce and strengthen the African National Congress in its fight for the national and the national liberation of the African people.
- 3. ME BERSHIP.
  - (a) Membership shall be open to all African men and women between the ages of 12 and 40 years, who accept the creed of the C.Y.L. and undertake to carry oct its progra mme and policy; Provided that for the purposes of this clause, "African" shall be taken to include all persons who by general repute are accepted as Africans.
  - (b) (i) any person desiring to be admitted as a member shall be required to complete and sign a prescribed form of application for membership, which, together with the registration fee, shall be forwarded to local br nch secretary, or, where no branch exists, to the Regional secretary, or if there is no region, to the Provincial Organiser, or, in the absence of a Provincial branch, to the chief Organiser, and such secretary or or aniser shall report the said application at the following meeting of the 'xecutive Committee of which he is a member: Provided(1) That no application shall be refused or accepted before a period of at least three months from the date of such meeting shall have elapsed, (2) that an executive Committee may, upon receipt of an application permit the applicant to attend those meetings of the C.Y.L. which are intended for members only. (ii) In the event of the application being refused
    - the applicant shall be advised accordingly, and his registration fee shall be refunded in full.

(iii) If the application is approved, the applicant shall be duly notified, and shall subsequebtly be decleared a member at a special admission ceremony conducted as prescribed in the Rules and Regulations.

(c) Persons who are members of other political organisations shall not be admitted into nembership, and no member of the G.Y.L. may become/..... become a member of any other political organisation: Provided that the National Executive Conmittee shall have power to decide wither any particular organisation is a political organisation within the meaning of this section .

(d) Member ship shall be open to the following classes: -

- (i) <u>Aspirants</u> being persons whose applications for membership are still under consideration, and who have been granted the privilege of attending meetings in terms of Section (b)(1)(2) of this KXX Clause.
  - (ii) Juniors whose shall consist of those members not being ASpirants, who are either full-time students of educational institutions other than Universities, or below the age of 17 years.
  - (iii) Ordinary Hembers -Who shall consist of membe ers below the age of 40 years who are not Juniors or Aspirents.
  - (iv) Seniors who shall consist of persons over 40 years of ago who have been ordinary members for izascinanxa
- (x) Associates who shall be persons over 40 years of age who have been ordinary members for less than 5 years.

(c) (i) Ordinary members shall ipso facto be members of the A.N.C. and shall be subject to the provisions of the A.H.C. constitution, (ii) Aspirants, Seniors and Associates shall not be elected as office-bearers nor vote at meetings of the C.Y.L., provided that Seniors serving on committees shall have a right to vote at meetings of such committees. (iii) Only Juniors and Ordinary members may be elected as delegates to any meeting or conference whether called by the C.Y.L. or any other body.

by a Province has national significance it shall be carried out by the provincial committee from the standpoint of the national executive committee. Such action must be carried out in full co-operation and consultation with the N.E.C.

A member may be fined, suspended or expelled by an executive committee having jurisdiction over him if, in the opinion of such committee he has committed any breach of the constitution violated any principles of the C.Y.L., or acts in a manner deemed to be detrimental to the interests of the C.Y.L. or xeeted of the general interests of African Progress.

No such right shall be enjoyed by a member in respect of any other disciplinary measure taken against him.

- (a) Branches shall be entitled to representation at Provincial or National Conference on the basis of one delegate per 15 members, provided the number of delegates for each brauch
- shall never exceed ten. 16. A two-thirds majority shall be required to repeal or amend any provision of this constitution provided that three months notice of the proposel change is given to the L.E.C. before it is submitted to a National Youth Beague Conference.
- 17. Any matter for which this constitution makes no provision, the Constitution of the A.N.C. shall mutatis mutandis be followed.
