IDEAS FOR PAMFLET ON WAYS TO EVADE CONSCRIPTION

Legal Methods

Deferment or exemption on study, work, medical or welfare grounds.
Classification as a CO.

Exile.

Challenging the legality of your call-up even if it is on a minor technicality. An expert lawyer is useful here.

Offer to discuss your objections with the OC of your unit. This is only really feasible for campers and is easier if you are a commissioned officer. At best it is probably only a delaying tactic.

Illegal Methods

Please note : ECC cannot guarantee the effectiveness of any of these. However many of them have been used extensively over the years and tens of thousands of people were able to evade the SADF using 1 or more of them. Thus there is always a risk that you are 1 of the unlucky few that are caught. If so, one should either have an alternative plan available or be prepared to confront the SADF by refusing to serve.

If possible do not register.

Change your residential and work addresses without informing the SADF. Also ensure that nobody (who cannot be trusted) at your previous abode or work knows where you now live or work. Post office boxes and a telephone in a friend's name can be very useful here.

Do not report when called up. The chances are that so many others will also have stayed away that the MPs will not be able to follow everyone up. This works best if you are a camper at a very slack unit.

Post, or get a friend to post, a letter from outside South Africa telling the SADF that you are permanently resident outside the country. If necessary even the "independent homelands" can be used for this.

Do not collect any registered letters which you suspect may be from the SADF and do not allow anybody to do so on your behalf.

Inform the SADF that you intend to applying to the Board and delay actually applying. This should result in your call-up not being enforced and thereby should give you a few months breathing space.

Feign a serious physical and/or mental disability.

For Campers :

Bribe or blackmail the clerk who writes out call-ups at your unit.

Remove and destroy your file and all other records of your existence at your unit.

CONSCRIPTION

Although government has repealed the Population Registration Act, it continues to conscript white male South African youths for compulsory service in the South African Defence Force.

In some cases charges against conscientious objectors have been withdrawn. The majority of conscripts are not reporting for duty, and only a few of them are being arbitrarily prosecuted. Objections by the church to the continuation of the call-up have not been accepted.

Under these circumstances the church has a duty to advise its members whether or not to obey the provisions of the Defence Act in terms of which they are being called up. It has been decided to advise those who have been called up for duty not to cooperate with the South African Defence Force in this perpetuation of the racist policies of government.

This may be done in one of two ways.

First, a person who has been called up may refuse to serve. This ^{would} involve informing the Defence Force of your intention to refuse to serve, ~~reporting at the time and place at which you are required to do so, and formally refusing to serve.~~ ^{is unlikely to} Legal assistance ~~will be required for this procedure, which may result in prosecution;~~ ^{A person who is however} the sentence usually consists of a specified number of hours of ^{unpaid} community service. ^{Conscientious} ~~would face a sentence of~~ ^{people convicted of} ~~which~~

Secondly, you may merely fail to report. The most likely result would be that you will be ignored. ^{People convicted of} If, however, you are charged for failing to report, you will need legal assistance. ^{are fined.}

A register of ~~those who wish to take either of these steps openly~~ ^{people who are no longer prepared to co-operate with the call-up system} is being compiled by the End Conscription Campaign. If you desire not to serve in the Defence Force, the church encourages you to be open about it, and will ensure that you receive adequate support.

If you would like to pursue either of these alternatives, or if anyone known to you may wish to do so, please let me know at the conclusion of this service.

Although recognition of conscientious objectors is now provided in the Defence Act, this option cannot be recommended since such an application would also constitute an agreement with the conscription laws.
