Response to advertisements/media, Out of Step

Recruits would have different interests, skills, motivations in joining the organisation and differing levels of knowledge about the aims and objects of the organisation and its structure and functioning.

As part of any recruitment drive it would be necessary to have a process whereby new/potential members could be educated about ECC. This would enable new recruits to assess the organisation and their involvement.

Outreach has been involved in such a programme of introductory meetings informing potential new members about the democratic process, the organisation, its background, its structure and how it functions and its sub-coms. It is also proposed to hold educational forums/general interest meetings on a regular basis every 2 or 3 months.

Some assessment of new recruits would be possible in this period.

Housemeetings: Each subcom. should be able to host its own housemeeting tailored to its own needs to recruit, inform and motivate its own members.

Specific housemeetings arranged for specific groups e.g. conscripts, would seem to be effective.

Specific housemeetings arranged around a specific issue would be possible.

Outreach feels that specifically targeted housemeetings are effective - followup of participants is important either by 'parenting' or by newsletter.

To held for new recruits.

Specifically we need to be more systematic about rec-

ruiting and intergrating the many people who sympathise with and support the ECC.

We need to be clear about the various types of membership and what they mean.

1) Honorary Membership - intended for VIP's and nob. who would:

- * not pay subscription fees but who could be approached for denations
- * have their names used publically by the ECC
- * not participate in decision making but be approached for advice, comments, suggestions and support
- * be on the mailing list and invited to events.

2) Member/Affiliate/Subscriber Organisations - 'The Front', who would:

- * pay a subscription fee at the AGM
- * participate in decision making
- * have their names used by ECC as member organisations
- * be on the mailing list
- * be invited to events
- * participate in ECC activities

3) Associate/Supporter Members - who would:

- * pay a subscription fee
- * not participate in decision making
- * be on the mailing list
- * be invited to introductory/educational meetings
- * be invited to assist with campaigns, distribution of pamphlets, posters, newsletters
- * 2 monthly educational forums
- * have specific projects
- * possibly become active members by their participation in ECC activities and intergration into subcoms.

* become known to the organisation

4) Active Members - who would:

- * pay a subscription fee
- * participate in decision making/subcommittees
- * participate in ECC activities
- * attend all ECC functions

METHOD:

- 1) Preparation of a questionnaire/application form which would be available at all ECC forums and sent to all on the mailing list and to front organisations, which would also invite them to an educational forum
- 2) All media to either advise contact with office or have a simple application form
- 3) Preparation of media about ECC:
 - a) a booklet or pamphlet
 - b) a programme of educational forums/housemeetings
- 4) Out of Steps:

Have advert or insert and a letters page from supporters
- 5) Acknowledgement of membership through:
 - receipt
 - letter
 - badge or sticker

From completed application forms/questionnaires details of applicants to be tabulated for office use and distribution to Outreach/subcoms etc.
