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## German Armies Trapped In Dnieper Bend

### ENEMY STEADILY DRIVEN OUT OF UKRAINE

The capture of the cities of Dnepropetrovsk and Dnieprodzerzhinsk by the Red Army has created an ugly situation for the Germans in the Dnieper bend from which the German High Command is endeavouring to extricate the trapped Nazi armies. All Nazi military commentators now admit that the position on the Russian front is extremely grave.

The Russians are giving the Germans no opportunity to regroup. Tanks and motorised infantry are pursuing the enemy along roads littered with German dead, smashed Panzers, broken motor-lorries and wrecked equipment of every kind.

### INCREASING ALARM IN BERLIN

The Germans are racing to extricate their armies from the Dnieper bend tangle, before the Russian Army can seal the last railway exits, says a message from Moscow.

It is touch and go for them, for if the Krivoi Rog-Snamenka railway is cut, even continued possession of Krivoi Rog will not serve to keep open the narrowing bottle-neck to allow the German armies to be extricated from the trap.

The Russian Army in this sector is now striking in three directions—into the defences of Krivoi Rog, south and south-west from Dnepropetrovsk and west from Melitopol across open country above the Crimea.

South-west of Melitopol the Russians are rapidly enlarging the gap torn in the German "bowl" line, and have pushed through it eleven miles across the Nogais Steppe.

### Mussolini Tries to Tighten Discipline

The German news agency announces that a 43-point decree by Mussolini, aimed at tightening the discipline of the Italians, came into force on Tuesday.

The decree includes imprisonment, and in certain cases the death penalty, for publishing newspaper articles harmful to public security, for attending illegal meetings, for working radio transmitters, and listening to enemy broadcasts, for evading labour service and for taking part in strikes.

### ALLIES CAPTURE SEVEN MORE TOWNS IN ITALY

The Fifth and Eighth armies between them have captured seven more towns in Italy on their march to Rome. American troops, after occupying the town of Sparanise, 95 miles south of Rome, have advanced six miles north of this town and are jabbing at the heights which dominate the main road leading to Rome.

On the Adriatic coast, General Montgomery's forces are steadily concentrating their strength and firmly securing their bridgehead across the Trigno river, to form a third and still wider encircling movement to threaten Rome itself.

The new advances have carried them to Venafro, one of the buttresses of the German defence line.

The Eighth Army has moved forward substantially as the Germans fall back to their new line. The capture of Bojano and several heights on the mountain ridge to the east have prepared the way for a push to Isernia, the key communications centre of the region.

### Another Crippling Blow Struck at the Japanese

Another crippling blow has been struck at the Japanese air forces in the South-West Pacific. In two heavy attacks on successive days on the Vunakanau, Rapopo and Tohero aerodromes at Rabaul the Allies destroyed 123 Japanese planes for the loss of only four of their own. Rabaul was attacked as recently as October 20, and before that was very heavily bombed on October 12 and 13.

Reporting the latest attacks, a communiqué from General MacArthur's Headquarters, quoted by Reuter, states that some of them were made from tree-top height, and that considerable damage was done to ground installations, dispersal areas and supply dumps.

The communiqué also records a number of successful attacks on Japanese naval and cargo shipping. The enemy's losses included a destroyer.

### GERMAN BUTTRESS

Places captured on the Fifth Army's front include Rochetta, 1,200 feet high, which commands the Appian Way, and Ravoscanina, in the upper valley of the Volturno. The capture of this last town brings the Fifth Army to within 12 miles

### CURFEW HOURS FOR TRAM AND BUS TRANSPORT

At the request of the National Road Transportation Council the Minister of Transport on behalf of the Government, has ordered that from the 31st October, 1943, all public transport in South Africa will operate between the hours of 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. on Sundays, between the hours of 4.30 a.m. and 10 p.m. on Weekdays, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 10 p.m. on public holidays.

This Government order applies equally to all public passenger services throughout South Africa, European and non-European alike. This order has been brought into force in order to help South Africa's transport last out until after the war. All the factories which before the war made buses and trams, are today making machines for the war. And we cannot, therefore, receive any more buses in this country. If a bus were to break down there is no other to take its place. Therefore the Government must see that buses do not break down because the people need buses to get them to and from their work. The only way that buses can be made to last is by making sure that they are not worked too hard.

This is the reason why the Government will make buses stop running at the hours stated.

As the Government knows that there are some people who must go to work at very early hours on Sundays and public holidays, the Government has made provision for a few buses to run, only after the people have shown to the

Government the need for these buses. If you are one of the people who must go early to work on Sundays or public holidays you must speak to your employer. If your employer must have your services at early hours on these days he must write to the people operating the buses or the trams between your township and the city. When writing to these people he must tell them why he wants you to come to work early on Sundays and public holidays. He must give them your name and address and he must ask the people who operate the buses to make application to the Government so that they can get the permission to run these buses. Unless your employer does this for you buses will not be run other than at the times stated. The procedure to get extra buses at those times when the buses do not normally run applies, with equal force to all transport—European and Non-European buses and trams. The train service, however, is not affected. Trains will run as usual.

However, it must be emphasised that if the Government gives permission for special buses or special trams to run before the normal services begin these buses will be available only to workers who have to go early to their daily tasks. The buses may not carry other passengers. They are workers' buses.

These regulations which were published in the Government Gazette on Friday, October 15, 1943, have the full force of law.

### Pretoria Move to Aid Needy Africans

The recently reorganised Pretoria non-European branch of the Social Services Association of South Africa, in co-operation with various public bodies, is preparing to take over the administration of the numerous services for needy non-Europeans in Pretoria.

In a recent interview with the Secretary for Social Welfare, Mr. G. A. C. Kuschke, the executive committee of the association explained that it was prepared to administer a place of safety and detention for non-Europeans, an indigent, crippled and old-age home, the establishment and maintenance of a coloured and Asiatic labour exchange, the establishment of a juvenile affairs board, the establishment and maintenance of creches and nursery schools, and the establishment and maintenance of social welfare centres.

The committee was also willing to administer the scheme for feeding of Native school-children. Valuable experience had already been gathered since for the past few years about 3,000 school-children had been fed each winter.

The committee emphasised that it had set itself the task of co-ordinating social services among non-Europeans, rehabilitating criminals, and assisting the needy.

The Social Services Association in Pretoria has launched a public appeal for funds to enable it to proceed with its programme.

### Growing Anxiety in Balkans

The turn of events on the Russian front is absorbing the attention of all the Balkan peoples. It is being realised that not only the fate of the entire Ukraine, but also, possibly, of the

### Move to Educate All African Children

A conference which will urge the necessity for educating all African children will be held in Johannesburg on November 27. It is being promoted by Miss Eleanor Hawarden on behalf of the National Council of Women of Johannesburg.

Speaking at a meeting of the Council in the Jewish Guild Hall yesterday, Miss Hawarden said that three commissions had already reported that education for urban and rural African children was essential. Mrs. J. D. Rheneault Jones had put forward a ten-year plan for the absorption of African children into schools.

This was the opportune moment to press for the financing of African education from the pockets of the European taxpayer. The Minister of Finance, Mr. J. H. Hofmeyr, was personally sympathetic to the idea of financing African education out of general revenue, but would not act without positive public demand.

Miss Hawarden proposed to organise, as a means of emphasising this demand, a street procession of Europeans interested in the cause which would be joined by the African mothers who realised the evil influences to which their children were exposed in the streets.

This proposal was supported by the meeting, and the procession will be organised soon after the conference in November.

### Germans Expect Landing Soon in French Riviera

The Germans expect an Allied landing in the French Riviera shortly from Corsica, says the Berlin correspondent of the newspaper "Nya Dagblad Allemånd." Rommel is at present inspecting fortifications in the area.

A large number of Allied transports are reported to have arrived at Corsican ports in the last few weeks, bringing with them units of the British First Army.

It is suggested that the reports of Rommel inspecting and touring in the Balkans were deliberately spread by the Germans to camouflage his trip to the south of France.

Balkans, is at stake. Behind a facade of official calm real panic reigns, says the correspondent of The Times in Istanbul, in the Balkan countries allied with Germany, especially Romania. This is borne out by the fact that increasing numbers of wealthy Romanians are arriving in Turkey under various pretexts, but really with the object of finding a safe place for their money and jewels.

## Why the African Democratic Party?

Sir,

Mr. Self Mampuru has vividly outlined his case in defence of his own party. The African Democratic Party may probably be a good party; that we do not know yet, but what I fail to understand is how and why, if they mean to build or work with the Congress from within as they say, they start by criticising it when they themselves claim to be Congressmen. If Mr. S. Mampuru reckons, by virtue of his political ability, that the best is to form a party at the expense of the other, then I am afraid his party will not go far. It appears to me that the honourable gentleman misinterpreted Dr. Numa's speech.

One thing I can safely say is that as long as the Doctor follows or adheres to the policy of the Congress, we will follow him—and not when he follows the policy of the A.D.P. (and thereby becoming a traitor to the Congress) which apparently is not out to build but to destroy.

It must be well understood that charity begins at home not elsewhere. Apparently the slogan of the A.D.P. is: "Start outside not at home." Yet the Congress calls "come let us talk it over."

In his address on the 26th ultmo, the chairman of the A.D.P. said: The Congress machinery is not functioning well (meaning leaders) that is why we decided to form a party which is out for the destiny of the Africans. I would have understood if he had said: "We have failed in our endeavours to right the wrongs which are in the Congress and consequently we have lost confidence in the leaders of the Congress; so we appeal to the younger folk to do the work of the Congress." Instead, he bo'ly decided on his own, without consulting the Congress, to form a new party, linked with the Fourth International. Knowing very well that his home, the Congress, will be undermined by this new party yet he frankly stated that his party is prepared to affiliate to the Congress. It is rather surprising that the Original Manifesto of the A.D.P. should tally the ideas of the 4th International yet the Secretary frankly denies political co-operation with them. How is it that on the very day the A.D.P. meeting is launched the Fourth International issues a critique on which the A.D.P. can build? Probably this party is merely seeking political ends at the expense of the general public with the ultimate aim of acquiring political influence also at the expense of the general public.

## African Journalists Society

(By Walter M. B. Nhlalo)

I do not like being in possession of a great serviceable secret, I have to observe that discretion which always should—but seldom does—animate our gossipy profession. Still I am entitled to drop a few hints, a few facts and make brief comment.

For years, writers, professional journalists, free lancers and those interested in writing have been sorely anxious to know why such a society did not exist. On many occasions it was suggested that such a society be formed. It was given a kindly pat with one hand and a gentle jab with the other, just off the solar plexus.

If time was not ripe for its formation in the past it is very ripe now. This point of view is not personal, it has the full support of the grand veteran of journalism, Mr. R. V. Selope-Thema, the editor of this newspaper; whom I interviewed and with whom I discussed the matter.

Mr. Thema said the foundation of such a society would do service to all interested in writing, not only as a medium where they would learn to know each other as journalists but would encourage and bring to the limelight the unknown talents.

One of the tragedies in Bantudom is that much talent is dormant. Much talent rots because people have not learned that editors are just ordinary human beings and that each newspaper has a policy which binds everybody. Because of the colossal ignorance of many would-be writers as regards this aspect of the press, they have wrong and pitiable notions about editors.

If such a society should exist it will be rational, with one aim in view and that is to see to the betterment of the lot of writers. It is in the hands of the journalists themselves to improve their status and that of our newspapers, which though somewhat conventional, is disappointing.

Writers are the last people to be thanked or appreciated. A writer has no status of any sort. Not every man, however educated, is born a writer or a creative genius. It only comes, as does the total eclipse of the sun at rare intervals and why not encourage and help those few?

Even those of us in the journalistic field, without question, are without any appreciation of others of our profession who come and go. We journalists have not made spontaneous presentations which would be tangible expression to the tribute and honour of those who retire or leave the city. But how could we, without a society?

The running of the society would be decided by members. Some of us who belong to the London Writer's Circle know very well how much can be achieved by a unanimous voice. Intimacy of writers can open channels to the publication of books and the receiving of a square deal.

The idea of founding such a society is very good and its purpose just as good too. It will be a serviceable institution and should receive the support of writers, professional journalists, free lancers and all interested in journalism. A society of this nature would be no spoon-feeding but good preservation of the nation's literary talent.

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

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

## WE WERE RIGHT

Mr. Hosea Jaffe of the Fourth International has sent us an article which we publish elsewhere in this issue, in which he endeavours to show that his organisation is not the source from which the African Democratic Party draws its inspiration and support. "The 4th International's very first act in relation to the A.D.P.," he says, "was to take some of its provisional executive members severely and sharply to task in a long criticism of the first manifesto of the A.D.P., a criticism which was distributed for the first time at the inaugural meeting of the A.D.P." Mr. Jaffe, after making this interesting statement, asks: "Does this sound like the 'hand of Jacob'?" If so, it was most certainly a harsh hand, for the draftees of the A.D.P. manifesto were mercilessly castigated in our criticism."

That the 4th International should have taken the trouble to criticise the first manifesto of the African Democratic Party — a manifesto which according to the critique of the 4th International was never published—is an abundant proof, if proof be wanted, that the 4th International is deeply interested in the welfare of this party. Its severe castigation of some of the Party's executive members, was prompted by its patronising spirit, and by its desire to see the party coming into line with its militant spirit. If yours, Mr. Jaffe, was "a harsh hand," it was nevertheless a fatherly hand which the chairman of the Democratic Party said was constructive and helpful, when he paid tribute to the spirit of the 4th International at the inaugural meeting.

It is strange that although the critique of the 4th International "was shown for the first time to the founders of the Democratic Party at the meeting held at the Ritz Hall," and although they "had no opportunity of scrutinising these criticisms" nevertheless they "were satisfied that these criticisms were of a constructive nature and that members of the Fourth International supported the idea of the formation of the new Party." Perhaps Mr. Jaffe will throw a light on this queer action of the leaders of the Democratic Party whose intelligence and education, we maintain, would not have permitted them to come to the conclusion that the criticisms of the Fourth International "were of a constructive nature" without first scrutinising them. Under the circumstances, can any sensible man come to any conclusion other than that although the hand behind the Democratic Party is ostensibly that of Esau, the voice is that of Jacob?

Another interesting point on which we would like Mr. Jaffe to throw a little light is the denial by the founders of the Democratic Party of any knowledge of the supplementary programme which he (Mr. Jaffe) says "was afterwards, with few exceptions, reprinted as a supplementary programme of the A.D.P. itself." If the Fourth International is not "the hand behind the Democratic Party," why was it interested not only in criticising the Party's manifesto, but also in drawing up a supplementary programme which according to him the Party has eventually adopted? But we need not ask this question for while Mr. Jaffe's letter is supposed to be a denial of the Fourth International's connection with the African Democratic Party, nevertheless it is an admission of the fact that this organisation is the hand that rocks the cradle in which the Democratic Party is being nursed to life.

"While criticising the conservative leadership of the A.D.P." says Mr. Jaffe, "the 4th International at the same time pledges wholehearted support for the A.D.P. in-

asmuch as it wages a militant and mass struggle for full democratic rights and land." Is there any difference between supporting an organisation and being behind it? We see no difference. But we must point out that in our previous editorial we never said that "the 4th International was the hand of Jacob behind the African Democratic Party." What we said was that the similarity of the supplementary programme of the African Democratic Party and the alternative programme suggested by the Fourth International was such that we could not resist the temptation to say although the hand is that of Esau, the voice is that of Jacob. This statement, we are glad, has compelled Mr. Jaffe to let the cat out of the bag. He has admitted that the alternative programme suggested by the Fourth International has been adopted by the Democratic Party, thus proving that The Bantu World was right when it stated that the voice was that of Jacob and not that of the leaders of the Democratic Party.

## Education Can Help To Prevent Native Crime, Says Bishop

"It is a matter for astonishment that juvenile delinquency among African children is not more extensive than it is," said the Bishop of Pretoria, the Right Rev. Wilfrid Parker, in his report on Diocesan African missions to the Pretoria Diocesan Synod.

Education would go a long way to prevent this, but not the whole way, he said. Poverty was one of the contributing causes of African crime. There were altogether 70 schools under the superintendence of the church.

"Many of our school buildings are hopelessly inadequate in size, equipment and condition. It is to be hoped that the Government will subsidise generously the work that the missionary bodies are trying to do, but which is far beyond their unaided resources. It is little short of a scandal that only 25 per cent. of the African children of school-going age can attend school."

While criticising the conservative leadership of the A.D.P. the 4th International, at the same time, pledges wholehearted support for the A.D.P. inasmuch as it wages a MILITANT

AND MASS STRUGGLE FOR FULL DEMOCRATIC RIGHTS AND LAND, as opposed to the knee-bending and inactivity of the African National Congress. The 4th International's criticism of the A.D.P. Manifesto was constructive and contained an alternative programme for the A.D.P. a programme which was afterwards, with a few exceptions, reprinted as a supplementary programme of the A.D.P. itself. Nor did our supporters for the A.D.P. consist only in the drawing up of a strong programme of aims and methods. For the 4th International urged Africans to support the A.D.P. Anti-Tax Demonstration called outside the Law Courts on Friday, October 15th and issued a tellingly leaflet explaining the 4th International opposition to the Poll Tax.

These are the facts of the 4th International in relation to the A.D.P. The relation of the A.D.P. leaders, or some of them, to the 4th International is rather different. For these leaders have not only stated the truth by denying that the 4th International was the hand behind the A.D.P., but have taken such flight at our criticism of them and even of our support for the A.D.P. that they seem to be running away from our criticism and support.

Our position is clear: We deny and expose the accusations of the Bantu World. Secondly we oppose those who are trying to wreck the A.D.P. and are parties to the Congress which is being supported by the Bantu World and by the Communist Party. Thirdly we criticise the present conservative leaders of the A.D.P. and support the A.D.P. in all its struggle for full rights for the Non-Europeans and against colour bar and segregation. Fourthly and mainly, we look to the workers to be behind and to produce their leaders in their just struggles for land and bread and national freedom.

## REBELS AND ENEMIES OF CONGRESS

Many people have complained that leaders of Congress did not give them a lead as to what their attitude should be towards the African Democratic Party.

One of the reasons is that the leaders of the Congress and all those who are genuinely interested in the unity of our people do not enjoy personalities and mud-slinging. They neither believe that Congress should be built at the expense of others nor desire to build their own reputations at the expense of others who are endeavouring to advance the cause of our freedom. For this reason they have been reluctant to point a finger of scorn at their compatriots, professing to lead the African Democratic Party, who seem to be both confused and misguided as to what they want and mean to do. However, in view of the fact that the leaders of the African Democratic Party seem to have been the first group who endeavoured to set up an organisation at the expense of the African National Congress—they have violently attacked and condemned the Congress and its leadership (and we hope they include themselves, as we do not know when and why they left the Movement and its leadership). As members of the Movement and leaders of certain sections of it, they never gave their former colleagues in Congress the benefit of their brilliant ideas and newly-found theories and policies. They merely suddenly attacked and condemned the policy and leadership of the African National Congress in a manifesto and an addendum—the latter which has since been quietly withdrawn. This was a stab in the back. This was a Pearl Harbour.

All reasonable people hold that, if these gentlemen were sincere in their desire to promote unity and to strengthen the African National Congress, they would have submitted their suggestions to the Councils of Congress for consideration and could have also brought pressure to bear on those by organising the rank and file into the Congress in order to insure the support of their resolutions and motions at Congress conferences.

To say they are helping Congress by forming a new party which seeks individual membership like Congress and is independent of Congress, is to fool nobody, not even themselves. Their action is calculated to confuse, disintegrate and disorganise our people at a time when all circumstances demand that we close our ranks. The suggestion, therefore, of trying to unite our people, or of, helping Congress, by forming a new party, is as misleading as it is insincere. With our experience in watch-

ing the activities of the African Democratic Party up to date, the conclusion is irresistible that the African Democratic Party offers uncontested and secure positions for these self-appointed leaders of the party and for the Non-Africans who appear to be patrons and promoters of this disintegrating influence in the ranks of the Africans, it offers them a control over a certain section of Africans or a weakening and division of the African front so that they, the patrons, may take control of the African field and act as undisputed spokesmen of Africans on the grounds that there are too many African organisations claiming to be National with warring leadership.

The promoters of these schisms among Africans, be they Africans or otherwise, are not only enemies of, and rebels against, the African National Congress; but are allies of our oppressors and agents for prolonging our disabilities. In this the leaders of the party and their patrons have shown no vision and no regard for the cause of the people. We agree with them that where there is no vision the people perish. We feel that their actions, if not vigorously opposed, will cause our people to perish.

They are attempting to deceive the rank and file by saying they are helping the African National Congress. What they mean is to supplant the African National Congress with the African Democratic Party. They boast of going to control the leadership of the Congress.

The honest and honourable thing is for the leaders of the African Democratic Party to strike out on their own instead of attacking and condemning the Congress and pretend to be with Congress. Congress considers them rebels and enemies, and Congress will take measures arising from the changed relations to see that no outsiders will disturb the Movement in its domestic policy or control.

We, Africans, are suffering from the disease of everybody considering himself a leader even with nobody to follow.

We warn our people to be aware of these false prophets. They are leading us into the wilderness. The new party can only serve personal interests of certain leaders and their patrons.

We urge the rank and file to stick to their weather-beaten friend and mouth-piece, the African National Congress. They must join it in their hundreds of thousands and through it march to Freedom.

### East African Troops For India

Crowds of East African troops, including large numbers of artillerymen, recently left Kenya for Ceylon and India, states a message from Nairobi.

In addition to field artillery, there were also anti-aircraft batteries and anti-tank units, all manned by Africans, with British officers and N.C.O.'s.

As in the case of armoured units, East African artillery underwent a process of "Africanisation" during the period of reorganising and training a large force after the end of the Abyssinian campaign.

#### SKILLED GUNNERS

These African gunners saw service at Gondar and in Madagascar, where they handled 25 pounders with great skill. Many officers and N.C.O.s who have gone with them to Ceylon and India have seen service in France, Belgium and the Middle East.

Among these African gunners are natives of Uganda, whose higher education includes trigonometry and logarithms. At the other end of the scale are Africans making their first sea voyage, who believed that ships crossed the ocean beds on wheels.

Let the Africans be up and doing and rise to the demands of the times through which we are passing. Greater sacrifices are called for from all our people. We are making history and building a nation. We have no time to waste. Every day from now must be used for Congress and this Conference in every town and district. Every member must play his part in building up the case for the African's freedom and progress.

## Church Heroes

"Rejoice, and be exceeding glad" Command of Jesus. St. Matthew, 5, verse 12.

Dear Bantu Sisters,

The world owes much to the prayers of a little-known white woman, Mrs. Mackay. Mrs. Mackay's earnest prayer that her son, Alexander, should become a good minister of God's was very wonderfully answered.

Alexander spent an extremely active, full childhood. He was interested in everything around him, and early learnt to use his hands in practical ways. The village blacksmith, carpenter, miller and saddler were all his friends, and taught him valuable bits of knowledge about their work.

After leaving school, Alexander worked in big shipyards and studied engineering.

On completing his engineering course, instead of seeking well paid work, fired by Livingstone's example, Alexander sailed for Uganda, as a missionary.

Mackay's journey from Zanzibar to the capital of M'tesa, King of Uganda, is a record of dauntless determination, hard work and skill. After marching hundreds of miles, Mackay nearly died of fever and had to be carried back to the coast. On recovering, he started the long march again. Many miles of thick jungle had to be cleared away. Part of the journey was done by water. Alexander was shipwrecked, and twice he had almost to rebuild his boat. Finally he reached King M'tesa's capital.

Mackay immediately set to work. He had a printing press, and was the first man to print the Baganda language. Mackay did not succeed in influencing M'tesa much, but he did succeed in stopping the slave trade.

When M'tesa died, M'wanga, a weak youth of eighteen became king. M'wanga's mind was poisoned by his jealousy against Mackay. Mackay taught some of the Baganda boys to read and write, but above all, to love Jesus Christ.

Three boys, Seruwanga, Kakumba and Lugalama, were one day seized, their arms cut off, and then they were burnt to death, because they were Christians. The eldest was fifteen years old, and the youngest twelve. Those watching could scarcely believe their ears, when out of the flames and smoke, a boy's voice was heard singing:

"Daily, daily sing to Jesus  
Sing, my soul, His praises due."

Although Mackay's clothes were ruthlessly torn off him, M'wanga at first feared to hurt Mackay, because M'wanga thought Mackay was a wizard. Late Mackay's life was in constant danger.

Bishop Hannington, on his way to help Mackay with Christ's work, was murdered at M'wanga's orders, also another Christian Baganda boy, called Balikudembe. Then forty-six men and boys were also burnt to death, but the Christians grew in number. At last

(Continued from column 2) are the parent of a child, then you feel you have the right to say how it should contribute to the welfare of its generation. The child has other ideas, naturally. And when it grows forced to run in a rut, conflicts are bound to rise in the mind of the child and when these rise, some very tragic things may follow.

We should press for more high school education and for technical education. After the seventh or ninth standard, when the child already has "intelligent preferences" and knows what it likes to do best, then it may switch over to technical, professional or purely academic education. The aim of each good and reasonable parent should be to give the child the best chances in education along whatever lines appeal most to the child.

We must never forget that children are complete individuals like ourselves. A child whose natural talents point to his becoming a good teacher will never be satisfied with anything in life, other than being a teacher. Similarly, one fitted to be a Nurse or doctor will be happiest and at her best where her natural talents are able to come to full play.

In planning our children's careers, therefore, we must not fix rigid lines along which they must develop. We must be ready to give support and encouragement to the best energies of the child. The child's natural inclinations must lead us and not our own unsatisfied or disappointed ambitions. And, to ensure that the best results are obtained, there is need for a Teacher-Parents Association which will enable parents to appreciate the education or training of their children under the guidance and co-operation of the teacher.

even one's ways of thinking, and, some scientists are beginning to admit, edibility. Thus, a well-fed child has that curiosity and eagerness to know which should be in every child's make-up, whilst the starving child is easily bored, irritable and unable to concentrate. You find this even among adults, particularly where people do skilled work or semi-skilled work. A well-nourished man is cheerful, efficient and hard-working, whereas a man who is not paid sufficiently to get nourishing food is listless, dull, inefficient and finds great difficulty when he tries to concentrate on his work.

Because the majority of our people are undernourished, they tend to be inefficient and unable to concentrate and these weaknesses are often attributed to racial causes, when, in fact, the underlying cause is nourishment and with it, therefore, wages.

Food plays a very important role in the health and development of any people. If the African is poorly fed, he will easily succumb to disease and after that become extinct.




