Feb. 2 nd	Tuesday	to the back of Chapel & kept alight - At the Gradual the Sacristan brought them forward to Sisters' stalls & held up for Rev. Mother & Sister on other side to light their candle from, & so the light was passed to each in stalls. The 2 lighted candles were then stood by the 2 end stalls - from which to light candles for the Consecrations. - Only Sisters held lighted candles for the Gospel and at the Consecration - They were extinguished at the word "Wherefore" - in the prayer of Consecration - as well as after the Gospel. <u>Solemn Vespers 4¹⁵</u> Visitors with the Associates sat in the Chairs.
