Mr. Deputy Mayor,

(i)

Plans have been prepared for the erection of a 60-bed home for the feeble & frail-aged which is to be built around the "John Fotheringham Clinic" (Out-patients' Department) which is to be established on the Randjeslaagje Home Estate. The development of this latter project is due mainly to a bequest of R30,000 received from the late Mr. John Fotheringham who was Mayor of Johannesburg in 1936 when Randjeslaagje was opened.

The cost of the clinic & the 60-bed home will be in the region of R300,000.

(ii)

Furthermore, Randjeslaagje allocated an adequate area of its grounds for the Rotary Park Scheme and, in addition, agreed to pay for the erection of 30 flats at a cost of R100,000.

Hence the inroads into the organization's accumulated funds, of which you spoke These three investments (Home, clinic & Rotary Park) will involve a reduction of approx. R12,000 in its income in 1969 & in future years.
