A lengthy memorandum was put in. It stated that a cause of dissatisfaction was the indefinite nature of the contract agreements between the farmer and his labour tenants. They did not know where they stood and in some cases no monthly pay was ever given to labour tenants. Where they were paid they got anything from 2s to 10s a month, but they incurred so much debt to the farmer that they were unable to wipe it off.

Certain Documents Found

The French authurities are facing trouble in North Africa caused partly by grievances of the Native population, who are suffering from drought and poor crops, and partly by heavy taxes on imports, such as tea, coffee and sugar.

It is understood, however, that the authurities are convinced that, as a result of the seizure of certain documents found on arrested agitators, it has been established that the troubles were fomented and subsidised by foreign political influences interested in spreading trouble throughout French North Africa, Egpyt, Syria, Palestine and the Mohammedan countries.

Most prominent Moroccans disapproved of the methods adopted by Moroccan Nationalists, but are anxious that France should accelerate the promulgation of certain promised laws aimed at the Social and economic improvement of the population.





Non-European Housing And | East London Native Administration Committee **Appeal For Home Brewing Of Kaffir** Beer

(BY J. SAFASONKA MPANZA)

On September 22, Mr. Mpanza said that this question was exhaus tively dealt with at the last meeting, and he did not wish to repeat what he had already said.

The question of kafflr beer was one of grave concern to the Native people, and the members of the Advisory Boards were present to act in an advisory capacity to the Council. The Johannesburg Joint Advisory Boards had already expressed their views on the subject. They unanimously however, it appeared that the Council was reluctant to let the Natives have their own way. He did not want the committee to think that he was impertinent but that he wanted to to make the views of his fellow men clearly understood. If the Council thought that whatever advice the Advisory Boards had given was useless, then there was no object in having these bodies.

It appeared that the Council was adopting the attitude of turning down the recomendations made by the Advisory Boards, which naturally influences people to think that the Boards were not doing their duty.

It was like a man going to a lawyer, asking him for his advice and then not accepting it.



Furthermore, kaffirbeer was not only their natural drink but something they could not do without. All Natives were not Christians, and the prohibiting of such Natives from brewing their own beer would be preventing them from complying with their customary ceremonies,

In certain Native ceremonies the brewing of beer is essential such as in the death of a father or the mother, the heir has in due course to brew kaffir beer and slaughter a beast for cleansing. of the family, Everybody is allowed at least to follow his particular custom, and he thought it was unfair that Natives should debarred from following theirs. Europeans were drinking liquor with a high percentage of alcohol and yet the council was stopping the Natives from drinking beer with only three and a half per centalcohol. Mr. Mfeka (Western Township) supported Mr Mpanza strongly.







A Government Committee, has been appointed to enquire into the problem of the shortage of Native Farm Labour in the Union. The Committee is called the Native Farm Labour Committee.

This Committee will welcome evidence from the Bantu people as to the reason why European farmers cannot get enough labour ers on their farms, and Native workers on European land will give evidence as to the conditions prevailing. If, however, Chiefs have any evidence they wish to bring forward with regard to the treatment of their tribesmen on European farms, that evidence will be taken.

As far as possible the evidence should take the form of definite statements of fact (i.e. as to wages; length of service; rations; other conditions of life including housing, churches, schools medical attention; requirements of the labour of other members of the lamilies; stock permited, etc.)



Fruit Cakes For Christmas

Garden (By M.G.) Garden lovers have had a long battle keeping their plants alive during this unusually dry weather Before these gardening notes go to print we may have the much needed rain (and I hope we do!) but in case we don't, here are a few tips for the amateur gardener.

When rains fail to fall the most important thing is to prevent the ground from "caking"-ie., from forming a hard smooth crust on the surface. This is now you set about it.

Do your watering either early in the morning or late in the afternoon, when the air is cool. Personally, I find the late afternoon is best. Then by about ten o'clock next morning I go the rounds with allittle gardening fork and gently (and carefully !) loosen the top soil in between the plants. Care must be taken not to dig deeply otherwise the tender roots will be damaged.

This loosening of the soil is necessary, for this reason : if the damp ground is left undisturbed little air-cells form and cause rapid evaporation—breaking the top surface also breaks the little air cells and the moisture does not evapourate (dry up) so quickly. And the next time you water, the loosened soil will absorb every drops, and none will run to waste as would be the case if the surface was dry and smooth.

Here is another tip which will help retain moisture and also benefit the soil :- grass clippings, dead leaves and flowers and discarded vegetable tops chopped up should be spread over the surface and lightly forked in. If your garden is not proving to be "a thing of joy and beauty," do not lose heart yet. Rome was not built in a day and a flower garden is seldom a success the fist season.



Guest towels are a necessity in our homes and the one shown here would charm any guest as it is embroidered in such an unusal design. To make it you will need: -1 Skein each Anchor Stranded

Cotton F687 (Orange Rind) F545 (Dark Salmon Pink). Three guaters yard Huckaback

15" wide. Crewel Needle No. 6.

Transfer P704-D11.

To place the design on the material for working, at one end stamp the scallop and fish, but at the other end only the scallop. Three strands of the Anchor Stranded cotton are used throughout the embroidery.

The stitches used are stem, seeding and button. Outline the fish in stem stitch ; working the big fish in dark salmon pink, and the small fish, outlining heads, tails and fins in dark salmon pink, work their bodies in orange rind | ing threepence in stamps.

shade. Work all the fishes eyes in dark salmon pink with stem stitch. Work the bodies of the big fish with seeding in dark salmon pink and the head of the small fish in the same colour with seeding stitch.

Work the scallop in button stitch, doing the large scallops in orange rind shade, the small scallops at both ends in dark salmon pink; and the small scallop between the large ones in dark salmon pink and orange rind shade alternately, working from the lefthand side.

When the embroidery is completed cut out the buttonstitch scallops with a pair of sharp scissors. Press on the wrong side of the work a hot iron using a damp cloth.

In Your Sick-room


Perfume is often misused in a sick room. It is sprinkled just anywhere. and if not of the best quality, leaves a stale odour in a short time. Only good lavendar water or good Eau de Cologne should be used in small quantities on the invalid's handkerchief, hands and forehead.

Toilet vinegar must not be too treely used on the face, as it is apt to make added, in quantity, to the patient's washing water.

Carbonate of magnesia dusted over the feet is soothing to a feverish patient. It can be used alone or mixed with equal parts of rice powder. A satisfactory liquid preparation is composed of 10 drops formic acid, one ounce methylated spirit and haif an once of water. A powder composed of equal parts of salicylic acid and French chalk suits some feet better than anything else. The salicylic acid must be in very fine powder,

Boracic ointment is safe to use on small scratches or obrasions, and is quite simple to make at home. Break one ounce of hard paraffin wax into small. pieces, and place it in a large saucerover a saucepan of boiling water When melted, add two ounces of vase, line, stir well, and sift in, gradually. four drachms of boracic acid powder A good plan is to tie a piece of white muslin over a small tin continuing the acid, so that it can be evenly sifted in. The great secret in making a good ointment is to stir continually until it is cold.



"There may be Europeans who disapprove of educating the Native," says Father Raymond Raynes, "but if they think it can be kept down they are indulging in a vain hope. History shows us that you cannot for ever repress a virile mation, nor deprive them of those things to which they have a natural and a moral right."

Any impartial student of theposition of education of the Native people in South Africa today, could only describe the situation as deplorable and chaotic and especially in the Transvaalthough in no part of the Union is it what it should be.

A few facts will illustrate this In the Transvaal there is only one Government school, and even this is housed in hired buildings and grossly overcrowded. In 1935 when reporters from the leading news papers visited Native schools in and around

Johannesburg, they described the school as the worst they had seen. All the other schools have been provided by Missionssome of these are Government aided-the aid consisting in the payment of some teachers-some are private schools for which the mission is entirely responsible.

All the schools are under-staffed and in many causes the buildings are inadequate or badly adapted for school purposes. This is bound to be the case when Missions are striving to keep pace with the ever growing demand for educa tion. It is interesting to note that much of the capital expenditure on buildings, has come from the Native people themselves. In the statistical table on the matter on page 79 of the Inter-Department Committee on Native Education, the following figures will show this: Total value of School Buildings in the Union £934,461 Amount contributed by Native people £384,584. All honour to them.

Future Generations

Naturally education cannot stand still. There must be expansion and development. There may be Europeans who disapprove of educating the Native, but if they think it can be kept down, they are indulging in a vain hope.

History shows us that you cannot for ever repress a virile nation, nor deprive them of those things to which they have a natural and a moral right-and the more that a government tries to do so, the more the crop of evil things it lays up in store for future generations. Moreover, once a Native works for or comes into contact with educated people-his 'education" has begun and nothing can stop its continuance.

Naturally, there is a rapid and growing increase in Native delinquency as thousand upon thousand children are growing without the discipline and self-control that comes from attendance at school

Their playground is the streets of the locations and towns, and all they are learning is vice and crime. Morally, socially and economically, this is an appal. ing state of affairs. It is the duty of every strong Christian person of whatever race to make himself acquainted with these facts, and to use whatever influence he masto get them righted.



The procession started at the City Hall, where the children were honoured by her Excellency, Lady Duncan. The scene was very impressive. Street collectors were at almost every corner of the city.



VACCINATION OF PEOPLE IN PIETERSBURG

A little known disease descri bed by doctors as a cross between smallpox and chickenpox and called "arrass" has been playing havoc with the 250.000 Africans resident in the Pansberg district.

The magistrate at Louis Tri Natives had had the disease as slightest provocation. well as a European doctor, but it was now well under control.

Thousands of Africans have been vaccinated as well as a large number of Europeans.

Spick And Span African Houses At Randfontein

SEVENTEEN homes in the Randfontein Native Location were visited on Weonesday afternoon and found to be spick and spin, orderly and meticulously clean They compared more than fivour bley with many of those owned by Europeans. In most READ cases the furniture was good while the harmony of colour showed attention to detail and pride of possession.

The visit was made in the company of the Mayoress of Randfontein. Mrs C. J. Kloppers, and the Deputy Mayoress, Mrs J. B. Mackenzie, who judged the entries in the annual competition for neatness and tidiness in location homes. The visitors were taken round by the Superintentdent, Mr J. Dowdeswell, whose cheery greeting was the open sesame to all houses.

The competiton was divided into two classes, one for substantially built houses-many of them worth of place in our own townships-and the other for smaller places. .

There were more than 200 entries for the competition. Such keenness is in itself a tribute to the inspiration of Mr Dowdeswell.

It is alleged that the men obtain the weapons, which include battle axes. knives, assegais, and daggers, from store-keepers in towns on the Rand and on their chardt stated that at least 1,500 return home use them on the

> Another allegation is that on occasion the weapons are manu. factured by Natives in the compounds.

From June to September about 100 Africans were prosecuted in one town in the Union for being in possession of dangerous weapons and that serious cases of assault were committed when the weapons were used.

It is believed that when men buy the weapons from storekeepers on the Witwater rand, particularly on the East Rand, they refuse to disclose the sellers' names.

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
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
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
