This Council having carefully considered a further reply of the Acting Prime Minister finds itself unable to discover in statement any disposition on the part of the Government to undertake a thorough going revision of its Native Policy in order to bring it into line with the changing conditions of Native life.

-2-

Since its inception this Council has loyally co-operated with the Government and would continue to do so as long as it is not expected either expressly or by implication to sacrifice in the process the legitimate rights and interests of the African people.

-3-

In the circumstances this Council feels compelled to adjourn the session in order to make possible for the Councillors to make fully known to the African people the nature and context of the Acting Prime Minister's statement.

-4-

This Council makes further appeal to the Government to undertake such a revision of its Native policy with a view to making possible better co-operation between black and white in this country.
