As it were, the Financial Organisational faults of the past appear to us in the distant Horison - as a watch word of success to our National Aspiration of a greater Nationalism. As a pure and God implanted Race in Africa our mother Country, we must have a place.

- To organise million Africans in the Transvaal, I suggest
 (a) That the Exe cutive C mmittee employ as at present,
 an additional five field Secretaries, (Organising Secretarires)
 whose duty it will be to organise, reports investigate and
 inspect grievances on Farms, secondary industries, etc., etc., and
 act as Political Agencies of a diplomatic nature
- (b) For every new member brought into the fold a 1/- of the 2/6 membership fee be credited to the Field Secretary in his area, and for every Renewal a od of the 2/6 be credited to the Agent and pay them each examplary salary of £15-0-0 per month with Transport allowance. The Organisers to zoned, prefarably one should be an African Lady.
- (c) That each of the Field Secretaries make their Organisational Reports to the General Secretary, and the Financial Reports to the Treasurer These Reports should be in writing monthly or quarterly.

The Executive Committee should allow all Organisers direct excess to the Committee, in all matters dealing with their respective zone, and where the matter is urgent the report be immediate.

- (a) Funds to ber raised by the above means voluntary subscription donations from Firms, mining Houses etc. etc., concerts, dances Competitions..
- (e) And last but by no means least, membership Competitions, to Branches, Individuals members, That Gold Medals of Merit be struck for presentation each year on half yearly "Tshaka's Medal" Mosesh's Medal" Hintsa's Dube's Makhatho's Letseleba's and so on.
