

ACCOMMODATION ARRANGEMENTS

FRIDAY MARCH 14th

DELEGATES ARRIVING BY TRAIN will be met at Park Station by volunteers and escorted to Congress offices. Private transport can be arranged only in cases where delegates are unable to make their way to the office, e.g. with heavy luggage or in cases where delegates cannot walk. In such cases the volunteer on duty at the station must send a message to the Congress office. 4 volunteers should be on duty at Park Station from 6 a.m. to meet trains - 2 to escort delegates to the Congress office and 2 to remain at the station. Any train bookings required for the return journey should be made either before delegates leave the railway station or delegates must themselves be responsible for returning to the station later if the booking office is not open.

ON ARRIVAL AT THE CONGRESS OFFICE delegates who have had long journeys will be provided with tea or coffee and sandwiches. Delegates will then be given their accommodation and food vouchers and volunteers will escort them by bus to their accommodation. After 4 p.m. private transport may be required as buses will be crowded.

DELEGATES ARRIVING BY ROAD will proceed by their own transport to the Western Region accompanied by volunteer guides.

ACCOMMODATION SLIPS. These will be in 3 different colours.

ACCOMMODATION COMMITTEE WOMEN will be on duty at the Congress office from 6 a.m. Friday, throughout Friday night, and Saturday morning and early afternoon.

If any delegates arrive too late to be sent on to their accommodation on Friday night, emergency arrangements will be made for them to rest at the Congress office until daylight.

SATURDAY MARCH 15th

For delegates reporting to the Congress office, arrangements will be as for Friday, except that private transport may be required from 11 a.m. to avoid bus queues.

DELEGATES REPORTING DIRECT TO CONFERENCE.

After reporting to the credentials table, delegates still requiring accommodation must be sent to the accommodation table which should be immediately behind the credentials table.

Credentials volunteers should be instructed to see that this is done, as great confusion and delay will result if delegates report for accommodation only at the end of the first day of Conference.

One or two volunteers should be in attendance at the Accommodation Table to arrange delegates in lines when many arrive at the same time, also to separate men and women, as accommodation has been listed separately.

AT THE CLOSE OF CONFERENCE ON THE FIRST DAY, three volunteers must take up their positions in separate corners of the site (or at convenient spots selected by the site managers) and hold up placards with the names of



the different areas. (These placards will be painted in pink, blue and white to match the accommodation slips).

The Chairman (or the site manager) must from the platform direct the delegates to assemble at these points, referring to the colours of the accommodation slips as well as to the names of the areas, e.g. "All delegates with pink accommodation slips please go to the PINK placard for Western Native Township". This will avoid delegates having to take out their slips to check on the address.

8 volunteers should be in attendance at these points to escort the delegates to their accommodation, and for each area one volunteer should be in charge. The same volunteers must be responsible for arranging to meet the delegates next morning and escorting them back to the Conference.

N.B. IT IS MOST IMPORTANT THAT CONFERENCE BE ADJOURNED NOT LATER THAN 6 p.m. ON SATURDAY, so that delegates can be taken to their accommodation before dark.
