ANNUAL REPORT 1954.

The period under review was one of considerable achievement in the Centre's efforts to fulfil its aims and objects of upbuilding the urban African in Body, Mind, Spirit and Character.

An extension of facilities and newly instituted Guest Night Programmes enabled the Centre to meet the needs of an expanding membership.

The administrative work of the Centre is the responsibility of the Secretary and Assistant Secretary who are directly responsible to the Executive Committee.

During the year, Mr. Johannes Maseko was appointed part-time Boxing Trainer. Through the help he gave to the young aspiring African Boxers, our membership in this activity has grown steadily.

Three cleaners are employed for the purpose of keeping the building and grounds in first-class condition.

There has been a considerable increase in membership during the year, the total paid-up members now numbering over 700.

ANNUAL FOUNDERS' DAY.

On the occasion of our Annual Founders' Day, held on the 28th October, 1954, we paid tribute to those responsible for the establishment of the Centre and to those Europeans and Africans who have co-perated with us in many ways.

The Guest Speaker on this occasion was the Bishop of Johannesburg, the Right Reverend R. Ambrose Reeves, who had just returned from the meeting of the World Council of Churches in the United States. Music for the celebration was provided by the Jan H. Hofmeyr School of Social Work students, supported by the African Swingsters Jazz Band.

SOCIAL FUNCTIONS.

Down through the years the Bantu Men's Social Centre has been a popular meeting place for individuals and organisations.

The Financial Statement shows a large amount received from the rental of the Centre's Hall. This is an indication of the extent to which the Hall is used by other organisations for Dances, Concerts, Plays, Boxing Tournaments and Conferences, as well as by individuals for Welcome, Farewell and Wedding Receptions.

The Centre also provides a convenient meeting place for Sporting Organisations, such as those for Rugby, Cricket, Golf, and Tennis. Boys' and Girls' Clubs, Girl Guides, the Wayfarers, and many religious and welfare organisations also use the Centre. The Municipal Health Department conducts a Mother's Clinic on two days each week

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

One of the main aims of the Centre is to help its members to spend their leisure-time to good advantage.

Under the auspices of the Literary and Cultural Committee a series of Guest Nights were provided members and their friends, these functions being held on Sunday evenings. Such subjects as Juvenile Delinquency, Marriage Problems of Africans, and Methods of Governing Africans in other parts of Africa, were dealt with in panel discussions and outstanding films were shown. Snacks consisting of meat pies and sausage rolls, with tea, were provided at a nominal price. The success of these Guest Nights has warranted their being continued into the present year.

The following activities, among others, have gained a permanent place in the Centre: Boxing, Fody-building (Weight Lifting), Table Tennis, Draughts, Chess, Tennis, American Easketbakk, and Volley Ball.

In September, 1954, the Bloemfontein Social Institute came to Johannesburg at the invitation of the Centre and played a series of competitive matches with members with the following results.

We are grateful, indeed for this fine social service Miss Teyise is rendering the bocial Centre.

OTHER ORGANISATIONS:

For many years the Centre has provided office accommodation for the Transvaal Association of Non-European Boys' Clubs and the Transvaal African Boy Scouts Council. Lodging is provided for twelve male students of the Jan H. Hofmeyr School of Social Work. Further, the whole student body of the School obtains its luncheons in the cafeteric. The Gymnasium is also made available for Physical Education Classes conducted by experts from the Witwatersrand Technical College.

The Eantu Men's Social Centre has many things to be thankful for, not the least of which are the enthusiasm of members, the loyal co-operation of the leaders of the different sectional activities, the devoted services of the staff, and the genuine interest of the members of the Executive Committee who give much time and energy and thought to the furtherance of the Institution's aims and objects.

We are most grateful to our subscribers and donors who have made it possible to complete the year's work with only a small deficit. We would express our special thanks to the Union Department of Docial Welfare, the City Council of Johannesburg, the Native Recruiting Corporation, and the Deferred Pay Board of Control.
