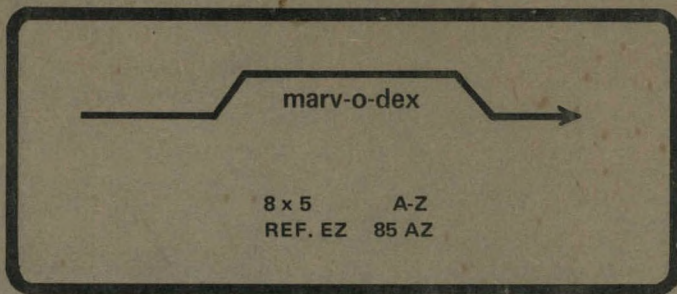

Emile R. Abadie

EMILE R. ABADIE, a member of the Institute since 1876, died at Nevada City, Cal., April 1, 1923, after a ten days' illness with influenza. He had been in that place only about two months, having been temporarily engaged in the installation of gold-saving equipment below the Empire mines at Grass Valley.

Mr. Abadie was born in St. Louis, Mo., about 1863, and was educated as a civil engineer at Washington University. Thereafter, he studied mining at Freiberg. His first connection with California mining was as superintendent for the North Star mine, at Grass Valley, when it belonged to W. B. Bourne. From there he went to South Africa where he remained for two years. He was next employed by the London Exploration Co., at the Grand Central mine, near Nogales, Mexico, where he remained for a number of years. In 1900 he returned to California as superintendent for the Champion mines, which he developed into a productive enterprise within three years. During his later years he served mainly as a consultant throughout California and Nevada.

Mr. Abadie was a man of quiet, unassuming disposition, who attracted and held strong friendships among those who recognized his technical ability and his high traits of character. He is survived by a widow, Eleanor L. Abadie, of San Francisco, a son E. R. Abadie, Jr., who also is a mining engineer, and by two grandchildren.
