### David Bruce

A David Bruce campaign group is being formed, and we must maintain close contact with it. David will probably raise the issues of SADF involvement in Angola, Namibia and the Townships. ECC must decide what action to take around David's campaign, and how to tie this action in with our campaign.

### Know Your Rights meetings

It is felt that Contact's proposal for a single meeting, expecting 500 people is unrealistic, and that more than one smaller meeting is called for. A suggestion is that each subgroup could organise one meeting for the sector of the public that it is closest to (eg. CRAG to organise a meeting for Yeoville Trendy Lefties, Contact to organise one for Yuppies.) The campaign groups role would be to coordinate the selection of speakers and venues, and to organise a single advert.

### Alternative Service Projects

The campaign group and Churches need to work together on this.

ECC members need to understand what the ASP is and why it is needed. The campaign group sees an ASP as a statement to the government and the general public that people outside ECC are pissed off with conscription and are prepared to do alternative service.

A number of associate members, and members of the public are interested in becoming involved in the ASP, and they should be incorporated into an ad hoc ASP group, together with Churches people.

It looks as if the ASP will take place in the Eastern Transvaal, and have something to do with refugees from Mocambique. This could involve pulling into an existing church project, or some

action in conjunction with SAVS, or the Ka Ngwane Youth Movement. This project will therefore be far away from Johannesburg and must be well coordinated and must allow people to come out for weekends only, as well as for a whole week.

### The Call Up

This year we must respond effectively to the call up. The GB must plan and execute some form of action. ECC must be active in church actions which are being organised.
