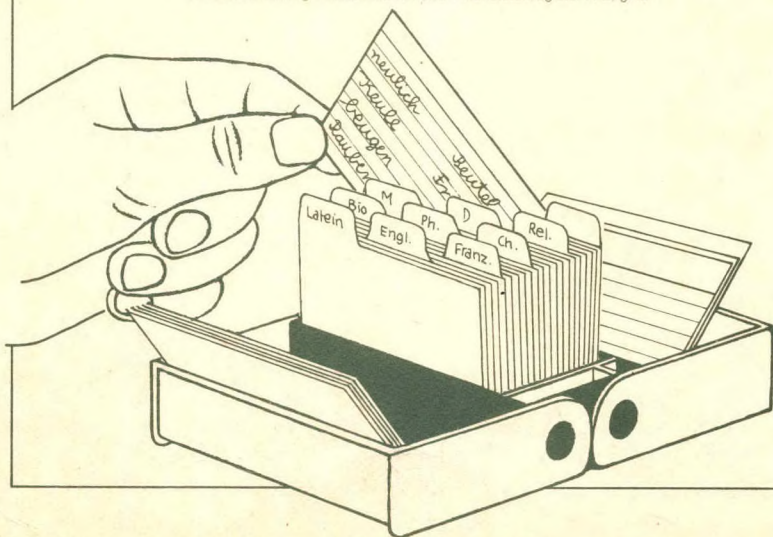

- arrived Pforzheim 2.25 met at station by Valter Behrens (OFG-VK) took to his house for coffee + cake.

- 4 pm interview with radio journalist from Welle Fidelitas - Cheryl spoke on a private radio station.

- 7 pm interview with two journalists from two local newspapers (press conference)
  - Daniel Zabor "Pforzheimer Kurier"
  - Marcus Shaible "Pforzheimer Zeitung"
- 8 pm Meeting hosted by DFG-VK + others very good meeting with good attendance of  $\approx 130$  people. Other such meetings by Nizkor have only drawn 30 people  $\therefore$  organisers were very pleased. Spoke after intro from DFG-VK person who had overheads + gave ABC of Apartheid + outlined Gnomon - SA links. Meeting started at 8 pm + lots of questions ended at 10.15 pm. Gave a push about Gnomon action + <sup>this</sup> spurred them to call together meeting to investigate taking action 13 people signed up for the meeting + will meet on Sunday. Pforzheimer has strong links with South Africa as it is a centre of the jewelry trade + uses a lot of gold from South Africa.
- Again met two people from SA, one a African student at university here, the other Nico Bekker who was fired by SAAPC. Very keen to be of help + lots of name dropping. His address is:

- Current project of DFG-VK is to assist Nazi deserters who are at present not entitled to war years credit to their pension 60 000 deserters were held in concentration camps + 15 000 executed.
- Pforzheimer was heavily bombed by Allies in Feb 45. Made bomb detonators. A few interesting theories about why it was not bombed earlier
  - 1) Perhaps a city to be targeted was the Atomic Bomb.
  - 2) US bought instruments from Gnomon, near end of war bombed as they



now developed their own instrument

3 Feb. Friday (Tübingen)

- caught Train from Pforzheim at 8.37 changed trains + arrived in Tübingen at 11.45.
- met at station by Jürgen Hasler of DFG-VK and two other members.
- taken to lunch at North African restaurant.
- 2 pm coffee + cake with members of DFG-VK and met two people from the military Counselling Network which primarily counsels USA soldiers based in Germany + helps them with problems that they may have. Also looks at the effect of US militarization on Germany + effects that it has on German people especially women. One was an American + close friend of Adele - had worked with Adele in America. Janice
- 3.30 did live radio interview on local radio station called "Püngeradio Achalm" in Reutlingen. Pacy sort of afternoon radio show had 3 x 3 min slots spread over 30 mins. Played Revolution song by Tracy Chapman after I had spoke. Interviewed by DJ who had cockney accent + then he translated my reply into German. Others felt it was good.
- 6.30 supper at Italian restaurant with DFG-VK
- Did taped radio interview with "Radio Newporkland" based in Reutlingen, just before the meeting.
- meeting at 8pm hosted by DFG-VK. Started off with local trade Union group singing a few freedom songs - made me feel homesick + moved. Local AAB speaker + DFG-VK. I spoke (well I thought) + then the usual questions, many of them. About 50 people which they were pleased about given it was Friday night and also carnival which is a catholic festival dating back to medieval times. People dress up + wear masks + generally have licence to do things they do not do during the rest of the year. Showed the peace festival video which about 20 stayed

to look at at the end. Jessica Storrer on the video singing went down well + someone gave me a badge from the East German Peace movement to give to her. I was presented with a T-Shirt.

- Before meeting visited local peace movement resource centre called "Freunderspädagogik".
- 11.45 drank beer with 10 DFG-UK people
- was suspicious person at meeting - german who said he was studying at wit. Also 2 germans who had lived in SA + a Black South African.
- Tübingen very pretty town 70 000 with 25 students. University dates from 1400's with the still using some of the buildings. Pretty town square with Town Hall 1500's. Stayed with Astrid + Andreas in old old house thin with 5 stories, 25m from town hall. Oldest house in Tübingen is 800 AD.

4 Feb Saturday (Tübingen - Mütlangen)

- 9am meeting with local anti Apartheid group over breakfast lasting to 10.30. Head of it is the ex-green Party MP Walter Schwenninger
- Went to see their stall selling german apples + books + pamphlets complete with violin player + taped freedom songs
- walked around town went to the church where there was choir practise complete with mini orchestra.
- Saw student protest in streets. Protesting against economic cuts + lack of student accommodation. Some students had occupied an old hospital that was owned by the university + demanded that it be made available to students as a place to stay. Were expecting the police to remove them.
- was supposedly a free day but was taken to Mütlangen by car in the afternoon to spend the night there, by Kathleen.
- Mütlangen is a small town that has an American nuclear missile base on the outskirts.

since 1983 peace groups have had blockades at the base + maintain a permanent vigil. Blockades consist of people sitting on the road in front of the base to prevent Pershing II missiles from either entering or leaving the base. Usually they are arrested + either fined or sent to jail between 2 - 4 months. But last year the US + USSR signed an agreement whereby the missiles at Mutlangen will be removed in two years time. The blockade at Mutlangen has generated lots of publicity. Through funds donated they have bought a house in the town where a community of 8 people live with many others staying for periods of time. They have a daily vigil outside the military base 7am + 6pm. Stand in a circle for 10-15m then sing a song. Was surprising for me that police did not intervene. 30m of meditation after the vigil.

- went to Greek restaurant for supper. Carnival time in Southern Germany - Catholic festival dating back from medieval times. ∴ silly season. Painted faces + fancy dresses at the restaurant with many streamers + much letting off of cap guns.
- after supper at the restaurant spoke to 3 Mutlangen people about ECC then wed 11.30

## 5 Feb Sunday (Mutlangen - Ulm)

- breakfast then caught train at 9.59
- arrived in Ulm at 12.42 + met by 2 members of the Ulmer Spätverweigerer UG. These are a group of ex-conscripts + reservists who are refusing to do any more military service. after the 14 months they are required to ~~serve~~ register as reservists + some may be required to do further service. They refuse to register + some of these members are sent to prison. a project they are working on at the moment is to build a memorial to all deserters from all wars. This is very controversial especially from the older generations. about 3 such memorials

have been evicted around the country, to date

- went to house of one of members in small village sat in Neu-Ulm + had lunch.
  - afternoon walk in "country" but lots of houses
  - coffee + cake
  - Short tour of university - very primitive
  - public meeting at 7.30 in "Mandela-Saal" organised by Ulmer Spätverweigerer. Impression that meeting not as well organised as at some, eg meeting started late + poor clearing, but well attended 130 people. Local choir started by singing freedom song - very good. Then me. Short break and I conducted radio interview with Jürgen Hans Wandel of Evangelische Rundfunkagentur Württemberg of Ulm Bureau. Local press was also in attendance at the talk. Then 30 mins questions - not as many as before. No time to slow peace festival video
  - afterwards supper + Beer Ulm Bed at 12.30.

- Breakfast 8.30
- went to see Ulm Münster, a cathedral with the tallest spire in ~~Europe~~ the world 130m. Cathedral built 1500's + took 300 yrs to complete. Walked round town
- left Ulm in inter city at 1.06 pm.
- after trip by train through Rhine Valley arrived in Bielefeld + Met at station by Christine + Son of OFG - VK of Muehlenstr 54

- Had supper at Greek Restaurant with members of OFG - VK - Carnival time at Restaurant!
- Bed 12.30 after wine at Son's house Art exhibits

8 Feb Wednesday (Bielefeld - Osnabrück)

- arrived at Osnabrück + met at station by Christiane Overger + Dieter of the Aktionszentrum 3 Welt, Pöster 29 4505 0541-707018
- went to Dieter's house coffee - then afternoon nap.
- 6 pm supper - Pizzas
- 8pm meeting hosted by above 3 world group. Short intro then me - talk, slides. about 50 people - group to not as well organised but pleased with turn off. Not as much interest in questions - Showed peace festival video. Quite a few newspapers at the meeting: "Evangelische Zeitung"  
"Neue Osnabrücker Zeitung"  
"Der Kirchenbote des Bistums Osnabrück"

- "Stand up" at 9.30
- Spoke to class of 40 school kids at 11.30 - 1pm. Staved Peace festival rides + started with bycelands concert. Went well + kids asked interesting questions.
- left station 1.40 + arrived in Münster at 2pm.
- Met by Thomas of AKAFRIK, Inginer Str 9, 4400 Münster 0251-66116. Largely an anti-apartheid group that focuses on human SA links but has good links with PC groupings. But does appear as if they cooperate well with AAB + have hosted AVE. But clear PC tendency. Group is relatively old + was active in supporting ZANU well organised - good resources + 2 office workers who have traveled in SA. Had later WM - big treat. Nice people - ECC had been recommended by PC connections as "only organizations of whites that have made big sacrifices."
- Press conference 3pm - no one turned up.
- hung around office then set up hall for meeting at 5pm - seemed to be but organised meeting with banners + posters.
- walked round town the had drink. Old town 50 000 students 300 pubs.
- meeting 8pm: disappointed in turnout. 50 people. DFG-VK speaker Me + slides questions OK. Meeting ended at 10.30
- Supper Greek restaurant - sleep 12.30.

## 10 Feb Friday (Münster - Bremen)

- up at 9.30 breakfast then hung around Akafrik office till train went.
- ECC invited to speak at university Anti-Apartheid week 24 April.
- left Münster at 1.57 + arrived at Bremen at 2.30.

- met at the station by Peter + personal English interpreter who would be with me for weekend. Coffee + cake at their house.
- went to office while they prepared  
for weekend seminar. Essentially arrived at prep work for seminar to be held with E + W German CO's. Put also to give info about CO in Poland, E Germany, SA + Holland.
- Drove out to Emsland to church center where public meeting took place organized by local church. Just myself who spoke + lots of good questions because participants of the conference were also at the meeting 8-10pm.
- after meeting drove to seminar place few beers + chat (20 people) then bed 12.30

## 11 Feb Saturday (Seminar Emsland)

### Human rights + War Resistance

- Berlin allowed for CO's during Russian revolution (4 Jan 1919) - see document.
- UN declaration for CO - outline of story went churches + working for churches to adopt resolution.
- Human rights dev. (17<sup>th</sup>) started with ending of slavery. Subject of international interest.
- Only after WWII was beginning of universal understanding of human rights.
- Protection of individual is function of the international community.
- Problem of declaration of human rights is that western countries have shaped the development of document.
- 1966 Human rights widened to include cultural + welfare aspects.
- for first time in Europe Helsinki conference on human rights became an international thing.
- dev has speeded up from fight against slavery 30 yrs from dev of human rights charter.
- 1972 human rights of CO division.

and had commission of lawyers + Judges.  
Since 1972 CO always on agenda but treated  
as individual cases.

• 1988 20 Dec - D COs in SA accepted as  
human right, reason because 3 world countries  
had become major force in UN. + all states  
should offer asylum to SA CO's.

• 1987 UN declared right of COs is right  
derived of free speech + personal development.  
Resolution adopted by all Nations except 2.  
Reason why CO been raised so often in UN is  
because of success of small groups - eg  
Quakers.

• even if CO conditions been improved still  
opposition in many countries for CO's to object.

• Not clear if UN general assembly would  
follow UN commission of human rights decision.

• UN is planning to have board to judge if  
people are CO's. Need better conditions for people  
to object.

• will discuss CO issue in Summer of 1989 in <sup>but hint</sup> UN <sup>in</sup> general assembly. # follow up. <sup>in Social</sup> <sup>A + Econ</sup> <sup>Committee</sup>

• perhaps turning point in human rights because of  
Estonian blue shirt for CO.

• USSR Pol amnesty for CO's since 1987, except  
for Afghan war deserters. Hungary + Poland  
recognise CO, believe will happen in USSR  
but not recognised at present + people are  
punished.

### CO in Poland

• Poland CO can't leave the country when  
doing alternative service

• 4 yrs ago problem about swearing to flag  
person resisted - org called Peace +  
Liberty was formed. Since last year to swear  
swearing to flag was stopped - all army soldiers had

• new text for swearing before flag, more liberal.

• CO for moral or religious reasons independent  
org to look after special cases.

NB

- catholic not accepted as CO, cause faith does not prevent them from serving.
- if active in Peace + Liberty org are accepted as CO, but if general pacifist the situation is not so clear.

- try to make alt service difficult as have to serve in rural + poor. If have special skill sometimes can't do alt service. Highly skilled people used for simple + ~~poor~~ work by building barracks - make alt service less attractive.

Freedom + Peace

- members of Peace + Liberty been betrayed because alt service reduced after being in jail - but serve full alt service.

- conflict with trade unions - workers who demand higher wages replaced by those doing alternative service

- alt service servers subject to military laws. still people go to jail cause do not accept alternative service.

- alt service 3 yrs - same pressure as being in the army - 3 weeks contact/leave in 3 yrs. don't do alt service in own community - alienated live in hostels. Want union for community servers.

- 2 yrs mil service + 1 yr after study. People who are not healthy can do civil service - not alternative service because has uniform + structure like army.

- but new laws

- CO's can get alt service but dependent on military officers/wins.

- have special military secondary schools then go to high military schools - if not then parents must pay for education.

- alt service CO's lucky, moved to civil service no longer CO.

- Freedom + Peace → fight against military service also: greenpeace, speed laws

- East bloc eastern march → protest 27 March.

## CO in Netherlands

- 1920 right to object
- WWII → before were doing all service small groups.
- after war, Indonesia war + CO was strongly limited, had to serve 4 yrs all service in wood camps
- 1950's CO liberation
- 1979 again made easier + so can CO if resist military service for things such as resisting nuclear war.
- independent commission which checks resumes if accepted get job in all service 70% of applicants are recognised → then go to 4 who gives report to 2<sup>nd</sup> commission which recognised 70% 3<sup>rd</sup> round can apply to the crown + will be accepted.
- Council of state represents the crown at end 100% usually accepted Procedure takes 1½ yrs if rejected can go into procedure again + again. conscription only up to 27/28 yrs.
- 120 000 liable to conscription
- army only needs 40 000 + calls them up + 4 000 would be CO's.
- mil service 14 months 18 months for full service. after mil service have reserve training as well.
- only a CO if called up ie part of 40 000 can object before, during + after military service.
- so all service in isolated places, Orgs who want to employ CO have to pay for CO + if skilled have to pay more. can't do all service in Peace groups
- Orgs pay 14 - 20 000 Dutch Guilders to gov who would pay CO minimum wage
- 2 000 doing all service 2<sup>000</sup> at university or objected after mil service
- Social 0 Total resisters: 18 month jail sentence usually rejudiced to 12 month, only one military prison + they don't want

total abjectors in their prison.

- Total abjectors have advantage because thrown in prison - don't have to await trial.
- CO's doing alt service only serve 14 months instead of 18 months with 3-5% doing this.
- Netherlands Peace Council suggest Netherlands to alt service in E. Europe + vice versa.
- churches left with legal procedure.

### CO in GDR

- Building soldiers 18 months 2500/yr
- 10 days basic service - ferry boats to soviet union. 360 building soldiers to support workers.
- 8 months heavy physical work with spade, earthworks.
- Building soldiers sent out to civil company, have to rent them + pay to army. ∴ have to keep soldiers busy + use them to replace machine
- 2nd yr worked on railways unloading granite + stone from railway trucks. Have day + night shifts.
- 7 week on night shift, better because can sleep during the day.
- subjected to military discipline such as marching
- frustrating being part of the military structure + discipline.
- 40-50% CO's church workers. CO not also a problem with normal workers. But maybe difficult to do higher education eg doctor if have been building soldier. University would usually select a normal soldier as opposed to a building soldier. - depends on political view of person in charge.
- reasons for CO - build peace, religious, don't want to carry guns - common aim.
- organization 2x seminar a year to inform people about building soldiers → part of army, earns money for army.
- 18 months → serve extra month in social department, same salary as they would get as

a soldier → as a sign that they are serious in wanting for peace  
• Total resister 1983 put into prison. Since 1985 Total resisters have been ignored by the gov, but could be charged. Called up to age of 26 or 35 if have been at university. Some were put in prison after the Mayday celebrations.

### CO in South Africa

- 1978 UN resolution saying in 5405 a crime + calling soldiers to resist - asylum
- 1980 stronger resolution instructing soldiers to give up arms.
