One hundred and fifty-six leading opponents of Apartheid were arrested in South Africa in December 1956. The case will probably drag on till at least towards the end of 1957. Some of the accused have already lost their jobs. Most are in no position to pay for legal aid. The position of the dependants of many of them is already serious. By the time the trial is over the plight of all, accused and dependants alike, will have become desperate.

At least £100,000 will be required for legal defence and aid; Christian Action aims to raise £20,000 towards this total.

Christian Action is working in closest touch with the committee responsible for the Defence and Aid Fund in South Africa.

The objects of our fund are: (a) to provide for the legal defence of the accused; (b) to aid the families and dependants of those arrested; and (c) to help to ensure that the conscience of the world is kept fully alive to the issues at stake.

The response to this appeal is already encouraging. In particular the Movement for Colonial Freedom has given its full support from the beginning; and many Church congregations, Friends Meetings, and Trade Union Branches, etc., have sent generous donations as a result of special collections.


