House of Mary Pretoria
Began in Prinsloo Street
then moved to 17 Church Street &
from there to 63 Schoeman Street

September 12th

S. Juliana Agnes & P. Stella Maud (who both arrived for England on Sep. 10.) via P. Stella for the D. G. Books kept at the Home of Mercy. Lady Hayes called in the afternoon.

13th Mr. Glynn - Mr. Simpson Mrs. Carey called. S. G. C. & P. H. went to Station about luggage.

14th Holy Cross Day. The Home was opened & blessed by the Bishop of Victoria at 5 p.m. There were present 2 Priests - 7 Sisters, Miss Mrs. Roman - Miss Simon & 2 others. After the Service the Sisters went to the School Chapel for an Address by the Bishop - after which S. G. C. had an interview with the Bishop.

15th S. Luyanni & S. G. C. went to a meeting of the Ladies' Committee at the Residence.

16th Mrs. Hillman came from Johannesburg as "unpaid help" - Cairns & Mr. Sidwell called.

18th 16th Sunday after Trinity. S. G. C. stayed at home during Mass. & with Mr. Hillman & P. Matus.

 trouble with L. Ford who finally left the home at 3 p.m.
26. S. Day took S.G.C. to the Police Station & see
 about a possible case
27. S. Day took S.G.C. & see Mr. Smith - the Treasurer

of the B. of Mercy in the morning - as the afternoon
to the Hospital -

29th Michaelmas Day. S.S.M. & S.W. & School Jr. Vespers. S.G.C.
