Over sixty people watched the demonstrations and amongst them there were a few women. Accompanying him was Mr. Ken Shaw who had organised the match.

Mr. Horace Lindrum thrilled the Growd with his accurate shots. He potted balls from all angles and he preformed many tricks with the balls to the joy of the Spectators. It was something worth watching. To those who were thre, it was an afternoon well spent.

## ACTIVITIES

- (a) <u>Body-building</u>: Under the leadership of Mr. Moss. Matlhaganyane. This section still attracts most of our members, especially now that more weights have been bought. Subscription fees are RL a month.
- (b). Boxing: Under the leadership of Mr. Klassie Links who has taken over from Mr. Joe Maseko who has resigned through unforeseen circunstances. We are sorry to miss his services.
- (c) <u>Billiards & Snooker</u>: These games are popular in the Centre and we still persuade Players to leave the room at closing time. Through shortage of Staff, we have had no chance of running competitions this year.
- (a) Judo: Under the leadership of Mr. O. Mbili. The Club has still not been properly organised through lack of a Judo mat. Many come to inquire about this activity including women.
- (e) <u>American Basketball</u>: Once a popular game in the Centre, has been gaining popularity, but when uniforms were stolen later in the year, members just kept away. A few matches were played during the year against Y.M.C.A. (D.O.C.C.) Orlando and Lionel Kent Centre, Daveyton. The B.M.S.C. only lost one match against Lionel Kent Centre.
- (f) <u>Table-tennis</u>: To show how interested some of our members are in this game, since we stopped buying balls, they buy their own balls.

- (g) <u>Draughts</u> This game is kept alive by few members who squeeze themselves in one of the corners in the Billiard room.
- (h) <u>Chess</u>: Members are not keen to learn this game. If any members are interested, an attempt could be made to teach them.
- (i) <u>Lawn-tennis</u>: There are few members interested in this game. This may be due to the fact that there are now many new Tennis Courts in the Townships which are probably more convenient to them.
- (j) Dance Schools: There are still two dance schools operating in the Centre, the B.M.S.C. dance school which has been under the Late Keith Sibiya and the Modernaire school of dancing under Mr. B. Mav. Mudau. The B.M.S.C. school has it's practices on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays. The Modernaire school has it's practices on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays. In the B.M.S.C. school nen pay R2 a month and Ladies R1.50 a month. Couples pay R3 a month. in the Modernaire school of dancing men pay R150 a month and Ladies R1.50 a month.

# SOCIAL AMENITIES

The Centre is still a rendezvous for many Organisations who use it for neetings notably, the J.A.F.A., African Burial Societies, Social Workers, Health Inspectors, Transvaal Golf Union, Transvaal African Rugby Union, Transvaal Cricket Union, Choral groups and Damae Bands, Connittee Members of these organisations pay membership fees to the Centre.

# HALL

The hall is hired to recognised organisations for Boxing Tournaments, Ballroon Dance Competitions, General dances, Concerts, Rehearsals, X-mas Parties and to private individuals for Wedding Receptions. Our worry which has been the shortage of chairs, has been solved by the purchase of one hundred single chairs.

# FIRST AID CLASSES

These are still held by the St. John's Ambulance every Monday evening for Industrial Workers. We have asked then to make a donation to the Centre.

#### FOUNDERS' DAY

The Founders' Day Celebrations were again a success this year. Over four hundred attended. The Guest Speaker was Mr. H.S. Ramaila, M.A. He spoke on "The significance of human dignity." The Messiah Choir and Tuning Forks entertained the Audience and dance music was given by the "Elite Swingsters Band."

#### OFFICES

There are still two of our rooms upstairs hired to (a) African Boy Scouts Association and (b) Transvaal Non-European Boy's and Girls Clubs.

## ACCOMMODATION

Four other rooms are rented to young men who are doing private studies and whose homes are out of Johannesburg.

## RESTAURANT

The Restaurant is still run by Mr. Z. Theys to the convenience of members. Meals have been raised from 15 Gents to 20 Gents a meal.

#### DEATH

We are sorry to record the death of our beloved Dance Teacher,

Mr. Keith Sibiya, who was brutally murdered in Durban on 15th October 1966, whilst attending the South African Non-European Dance Championships.
