" 10th S^r Lacta left by the 2³⁰ tug for the Edinburgh Castle sailing for England.

Brought many Xmas presents for Rest House, chiefly crockery.

" 14th M^{rs} Cook came for last injunctions

" 15th The party left for Pretoria. Bkfst. ^{filled by} 7 a.m.

Mare's House occupied for three weeks by M^r & M^{rs} Davidson & family.

- April 15th Sister Annette and Miss Hope arrived about 9 a.m. S.A. returned to East London in the afternoon to go to City Hall re - Electric light.
- 16th Mrs Cook in great trouble as Mr Cook had passed away.
- 2nd after Easter S. Miss Hope & S. Annette went to S. Peter's Church
- 19th The Rector called & brought some books.
- 22nd S.A. went to East London shopping called at Y.W.C.A. to see Miss Oldrey.

Sat 1st of May

All to Mass 7.30. At 9.30. The Rector the Curate & 2 servers came - had the cottage "blessed" - Sister Smily left at 11.0. Two men came to paint rooves & do odd jobs - Fish & flowers sent us. Miss Macdonald & Miss Douglas to call.

Sunday 2nd

All to Mass at 8 & 11. Sister Mary Joyce came in afternoon & stayed the night. all went to Mass at 7.30.

Ascension Day. All to Mass. S. Smith came over after breakfast. The Rector had a quiet day for us - (5) addresses at 10.3. Mabel slept at Mrs. Mitchell's - S. Mary Joseph only came Friday.

Friday 14th All to Mass. The two C.R. Sisters left at 9. we all went on rocks - back to dinner down again at 2.15. Saturday tea w. us - Read.

Sat 15th Rested - 8.30 breakfast - S. S. L. took Mabel May over to East London in Mass. returned at 1.30. Quiet afternoon.

Sunday 16. all to Early Service 11.00 - The Miss Reynolds & their baby nephew to tea.

Monday 17. all Rested - had sea day till 11. Mabel spent evg at the Reynolds.

- Monday 18th S. Sup to Early Mass. S. Smid breakfast in bed - Sat on rocks all the morning - Most of afternoon glorious day. W. J. & Miss Hewitt & Miss Odrey came to tea.

- Sunday 23rd all to 8 & 11 o'clock services - Inabel Whitson Day sea at Reynolds. S.E. poorly. all to memory
- Monday 24th S. Sup. to Early Mass. S. E. in bed. Miss Hope to tea at W. Reynolds
- Tuesday 25th S. Sup. & Miss Hope to Mass. S. E. much better. dinner 12.30 - all went by Jerry to Ocean Beach - tea over there - back at 5.30
