ANNUAL REPORT.

1946.

The report of the year is one covering a transitional stage of the work of the Centre; a year of adjustment from a war-time to a post-war period.

CHANGES IN STAFF.

During the year the Committee had accepted with regret the resignation of Mr. J.R. Rathebe, who had been released by the Committee to direct the Y.M.C.A. services amongst the Native Military Corps, during the war years. It was Mr. Rathebe's desire to continue with the Y.M.C.A. in its post-war schemes. The Committee felt he would render the Y.M.C.A. the same useful service he rendered the Social Centre. We wish Mr. Rathebe every success in his new field of work.

Early during the year the services of Mr. B. Koko, Acting Assistant Secretary, were terminated. Only during the latter part of the year, on the return of Mr. A.P. Khutlang from the army services, was it possible to re-inforce the administrative staff. We look forward with optimism to the year ahead of us.

Due to increased responsibilities on him Mr. J.D. Rheinallt Jones resigned from the Executive Committee. His resignation was accepted with regret, for he had well served the Centre for many years. His place has since been filled by Mr. Quintin Whyte, Acting Director of the Institute of Race Relations.

MEMBERSHIP.

Unlike the previous war years, when annual drops in membership were recorded, this year has maintained practically the same average of membership. There is every indication of an improvement, and with the following types of membership offered:-

RECREATION CONTROL OF THE PROPERTY OF THE PROP

The provision of leisure-time activity is the main interest of the Institution. The membership is provided with a variety of acitvities; Badmington, Billiards, Chess, Draughts, Ping-pong, Tennis, and Volley Ball, each having attracted a considerable following. In general there has been increased activity and corresponding proficiency in each, as evinced in the high standard displayed in the Championships. The visit of several sportsmen from Port Elizabeth in the mid-year made it possible to arrange several interesting indoor competitions. A Tour of several Social Institutions, during the coming year, has been planned.

BOXING AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION.

Boxing and Physical Education have become major activities of the Centre. So high has been the enthusiasm amongst the Junior membership, that the Gymnasium has become too small to hold them at one time, thus necessitating a division of the Group into several sections.

The Tournaments arranged during the year by the Transvaal Amateur Boxing Association, have outgrown the facilities of the hall, and it will now be necessary to find a place spacious enough to accommodate the increased numbers interested in the game.

ANNUAL FOUNDERS' DAY CELEBRATIONS.

Annual Founders' Day was held on Thursday, 7th. November, 1946, and a large crowd attended to pay respects to the memory of the Founders. The Guest of Honour, the Mayor of Johannesburg, Councillor James Gray, M.P.C. gave an inspiring address, and the Johannesburg Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of Mr. Joseph Trauneck, rendered an outstanding musical programme.

MID-DAY MEALS AND REFRESHMENTS.

A valuable service has been rendered members during the year in the provision of mid-day meals and refreshments. An up-to-date Kitchen and Tea-Lounge was erected during the year with the balance of funds from the Lighthome Bequest. The high cost of foodstuffs and the difficulty of running the Kitchen on a paying basis, led to the acceptance of an application by the African Providers, Ltd., to provide the service. This Firm has installed adequate equipment and staff and the meals and refreshments are now served throughout the day - a great convenience to members.

GUEST NIGHTS AND SOCIAL FUNCTIONS.

Several Guest Nights were held during the year. On these occasions members and guests were entertained to the programmes of Games, Concerts and Dances. Members have always enjoyed these occasions.

Besides Guest Nights several functions have been sponsored by Sporting and Charitable Groups, bringing the Centre into contact with various sections of the community along the Reef.

A number of Wedding, Welcome, Farewell, and Graduation receptions held during the year produced many gay scenes and happy hours.

GOOD FRIDAY.

On Good Friday the hall was crowded with members and their relatives and friends to see the Film " From the Manger to the Cross". Hymns and Commentary on the significance of the season added a solemn note to the gathering. This has become an annual feature to which members look forward.

The Social Centre has served as a neutral ground for Ministers of various denominations who have used the building for meetings of the African Inter-denominational Ministers Association. The continued use of the building by individual clergymen has served to create a wholesome Christian atmosphere.

PIANO TUITION.

Mr. W. Sihlali has continued to render useful service in giving a considerable number of interested members lessons in piano playing. The purchase of two more pianos will make it possible to cope with the demand for this type of tuition.

OTHER ORGANISATIONS.

Apart from housing the Jan H. Hofmeyr School of Social Work, the Pathfinder Boys Scouts Association and the Non-European section of the Johannesburg Public Library, the Social Centre has provided accommodation for the Transvaal Non-European Boys Clubs Association. The presence of these organisations has made the Centre as busy as a public market place as the members of each organisation moved in and out. This has led to the Social Centre being regarded throughout the Union of South Africa as a real centre of Bantu African Group life.

Most of Johannesburg African Social, Recreational, Industrial, Religious and Educational organisations have made extensive use of the premises during the year. So great has been the demand for the use of the hall and rooms that it has been impossible to cater adequately for all these organisations. Use of the stage and far corners of the building have had to be resorted to on occasion.

We again propose a hearty expression of thanks to the firm of Howard Pim and Hardy, who through our Honorary Treasurer, Mr. James Montague Pim, have wisely guided the finances of the Centre. We are deeply indebted also to the Union Department of Social Welfare; to the Johannesburg City Council: and to the Deferred Pay Board of Control of the mines, for substantial grants to our funds. We extend also our grateful thanks to the other donors and subscribers whose continued financial support has made possible another year of increasingly valuable service to the African Community.
