I am in receipt of your letter dated 23rd November, 1954, in regard to the above subject.

I regret having omitted to inform you that we were attending to the problems referred to in it.

We have not let the matter lie and have written to the Secretary for Native Affairs urging an inquiry upon him, and, while nothing may possibly be said to you - we have not mentioned your name - something should happen soon.

We decided that the best course was not for us to act, in view of the seriousness of the situation but the Native Affairs Department.

I am asking the Director to urge the Department to act with expedition in this matter in order to have the position cleared before the ploughing season is over.
