### Sir,

It has been very quiet since you passed here. I wonder where we can get help from? Ask Mr Haal what is happening? Does he refuse with money which is not his? Robinson had told him to send the money for advertisements here, but the account would be sent to Randfontein where it will be paid. Tell him that when you left for Cape-Town we asked Robinson to send us information; now it appears in the paper he refuses with it. What is worse is that there may be a strike at Randfontein. Had there been an advertisement in the paper every month, we would have avoided trouble. You do not send it now there will be trouble in getting the information and if he does not send it I must send them that information and they will be excited with the strike and payment will be delayed that is why I think that we will be obliged to wait for the £10-10s perhaps the strike will be over - probably next year.

Do please plead with the Chief for me. There will be a Congress again in July and we have sent the Chief an official letter of invitation and we asked him to tell the other Chiefs in these matters as the <u>Tsala</u> and congress work keeps me busy at top speed.
