ANNUAL ----- REPORT 1955.

The period under review was one of steady progress in the Centre's attempts to fulfill its aims and objects of upbuilding the African people, in Body, Mind, Spirit and Character.

The Bantu Men's Social Centre was founded in the year 1924, by people who were sympathetically disposed to the Africans. For over 30 years it has provided the focal point around which much of the life of urban African men has centred.

### STAFF:

The administrative work of the Centre is the responsibility of the Secretary Mr. B. Mav. Mudau and Assistant Secretary Mr. William Mbatha, who are directly responsible to the Executive Committee.

We are grateful to Mr. Johannes Maseko one of the professional boxers, for rendering part-time service to our physical training classes.

Three cleaners are employed for keeping the building and grounds in good condition.

### MEMBERSHIP:

During the year the Centre membership did not reach a high mark, partly because the Secretaries did not secure the usual clerical assistance from the Jan H. Hofmeyr School Students, who used to come for field work practice, and also because of the old members who did not renew their membership without pressure on them. Active paid-up membership on the 31st December, 1955 was 656.

Ordinary membership is for persons resident inside the Magisterial District of Johannesburg and Country membership is for those resident outside this area.

Junior membership is open to bona fide Scholars, whilst visiting membership is open to all Africans visiting Johannesburg.

### ANNUAL FOUNDERS DAY.

On the occasion of our Annual Founders Day commemoration service held on the 17th November, 1955, we paid tribute to those responsible for the establishment of the Bantu Men's Social Centre and we gratefully remembered the patronage extended to us by many European and Non-European friends and well-wishers.

The Guest Speaker for the occasion was Mrs. Maida Hall Xuma who had just returned from the Quadrennial Meeting of the Y.W.C.A. held in LONDON.

Music for the function was provided by the Jan H. Hofmeyr School of Social Work Students Choir, supported by the African Swingsters Jazz Band.

### Indoor and Outdoor Games.

One of the main aims of the Centre is to help the members spend their leisure time in healthful recreation.

A series of Guest Night Programmes was provided by the Literary and Cultural Committee on Sunday evenings. Topics affecting the Africans in particular were dealt with in panel discussions e.g. "The Africans and the Police, Marriage muddle and the way Out "outstanding films were shown such as "Pinky."

Under the auspices of the Lawn Tennis Committee our Tennis Section registered a definite advance.

During the year under review the Bantu Men's Social Centre tournaments as usual drew large numbers of competitors from all sides of the Rand to take part in the following games: Billiards, Snooker, Draughts, Chess, Table Tennis and Lawn Tennis.

### Inter Centre Competition.

On the 8th, 9th and 10th October, 1955 a team was sent to the Bloemfontein Bantu Social Institute to represent the Bantu Men's Social Centre in Billiards, Snooker, Fing-Pong, Draughts, Lawn Tennis and Debate.

The Gymnasium is also made available for Physical Education Classes conducted by experts from the Witwatersrand Technical College.

The Bantu Men's Social Centre has many things to be thankful for, not the least of which are the enthusiasm of members, the loyal co-operation of the leaders of the different sectional activities, the devoted services of the staff, and the genuine interest of the members of the Executive Committee who give much time and energy and thought to the furtherance of the Institution's aims and objects.

We are most grateful to our subscribers and donors who have made it possible to complete the year's work with only a small deficit. We would express cur special thanks to the Union Department of Social Welfare, the City Council of Johannesburg, the Native Recruiting Corporation, and the Deferred Tay Board of Control.
