

AN AFRICA LEADER IN COURT

ROBERT MANGALISO SOBU-
KWE, national president of the Pan African Congress, and two prominent Congress men appeared with 18 Africans in the Johannesburg Magistrate's Court on Saturday on charges of incitement and contravening a section of the pass laws.

The other two men were Kitchener Leballo, national secretary of the Pan African Congress and Josias Madzunya, a former leading member of the movement.

ALLEGED ASSAULT

Sobukwe alleged that some of the men with him had been assaulted by the police after their arrests. The magistrate, Mr. W. G. Vos, said the allegation would be noted but must be reported to the prison or police authorities.

Three other Africans appeared on allegations of contravening a section of the pass laws. This section deals with offenders who campaign against the law.

All 24 men were remanded to the Johannesburg Regional Court to appear on April 4. Cries of "Isama" and Pan Africanist salutes from the public gallery as the men left the dock.
