Dear Jones,

Thank you for the enclosed. It helps very much.

I hope you have followed our tour in the papers. As far as I can judge the feeling of my colleagues we

- (a) opposed to passes for women,
- (b) willing to allow municipalities which desire it to have a curfew between the hours of 10 and 5. PMBurg said that the town was asleep by 10.30!
- (c) prepared to press hard for municipal trading
- (d) moderately inclined to press for the extension of the min. wage  
There has been a large influx into Bfn since the award and we must use this to get awards in other Free State towns.
- (e) prepared to explore means of excluding Natives to overcrowded towns. This is going to be a real difficulty.

I feel that I have done good service by leading witnesses in their evidence so as to bring out the points I want to impress upon my colleagues. I also arranged for meetings with the J.C. at Durban ( there is no Ad Board ) and with both these bodies in Bloemfontein. Marquard did splendidly at Bfn and I had a lovely tussle with Stuart Franklin.

I had a meeting with the Ex Co in Durban. Confidentially they offer me the virtual Suptcy as from the date of my return, the real job when Bryan goes and they will allow me reasonable facilities to carry on with my outside interests. Of the amount of time for these I am to be the judge. I don't want to go but if the Rand Daily Mail is right H may drop me next year and I shall be sans job. I have been given till Dec 31 to decide and I shall consult with you before I take any action.

Equally private for fear I am prevented. I am going to Rhodesia and Bechuanaland next week to look at schools and other social work. I don't expect to get back to Pretoria till about Nov 9 or so. My present plan is to spend Nov 10 with you at Florida. I shall arrive early in the morning.

If you want to write me within the next week I think you should address letters care Judge Russell High Court Bulawayo.

A long letter which you sent to me in England with particulars of Univ of S.A. exams has been forwarded. Thank ~~you~~ you. I hope all goes well. My love to Helen and salaams to Mrs Jones,

have to give their own evidence  
as regards their arrangements in our  
location. Beyond that I know of  
no people. The representatives of  
churches, who have to do with the  
location might be mentioned. For the Anglican  
church I think it is Father Carter (Rosettenville)

and for the R. Catholic, it is Father Bonnard,  
 of R. C. Presbytery, Woburn Ave, Boston -  
 The Wesleyan & the <sup>Episcopalian</sup> Methodist, & Presbyterian  
 administered from 'Job'burg. -

There is a danger of receiving  
 v. poor evidence from the location advisory  
 Board here. Our Joint Council has  
 never been able to receive any serious  
 proposal from them. In fact most of  
 them are ~~more~~ <sup>for</sup> preserving the status  
 quo in the location here, where v. little  
 control has existed until lately. - This  
 speaks for itself.

Please keep this as confidential  
 The new Superintendent has not been  
 finally chosen. But he will be appointed  
 soon and the Commissioner will have  
 no doubt to take his evidence.

I am collecting information on  
 the lines suggested by your circular  
 and I shall call a special meeting  
 of the Joint Council, of which you will  
 be advised.
