Register

On coming to the Chaplaincy of  
Rotten Sand, which had been  
given up by the "Moravian Brethren",  
and held, for me, by Rev. R. Brooke,  
Church of England, Acting-Chaplain,  
for about five months, - I found  
no Burial Register of a date before  
1868, which contained, first 10,  
copied by Rev. R. Brooke, from  
Rev. A. Küster's memoranda.

Note 4. Above "Murray's-Bay",

No. 4. viz, the Bay on the East of the Head, there is a Burial-ground utterly neglected, which contained a few Monumental-Stones, of some interest. These Monumental-slabs are thrown down and broken. — This ground the best situated of all, and might be used again. I thought to be enclosed. —

Note 5. Tombs around the Church.
