

ADDEDDUM TO NATIONAL STRUCTURES REPORT

Timing of Election of National Workers and Regional Executives.

At present the unco-ordinated timing of exec elections in the regions and the appointment of national workers raises problems for the regions wishing to nominate national workers.

We recommend that appointments to national positions ideally occur before regional exec elections, approximately in October of each year. This would facilitate exec elections in November of each year, as well as enabling those appointed to the various national positions to work out their lives and prepare for the year ahead.

We have a situation now which means that National Organisers are appointed at different times during the year. This has the advantage of ensuring continuity, but the difficulty of finding an organiser at that time of the year may be a disadvantage. We recommend that regions consider possible nominations for the national organiser whose term of office would be due to start in August 1988, at the same time as they are considering the other 2 national appointments. Secondly, to consider the present system of staggered national organisers - whether its feasible to continue in this way - or whether we should revert to appointing all national workers at the same time of the year.
