

MEMORANDUM ON J.J. SCHOLTZ - D/HD/CONST. (76).

Witness reports one meeting , No. 260, p. 2844 (V.20) Ex. G. 443, which was also reported by Markram at p. 3829 (V.20). The witnesses appear to have reported different speakers. See notes on Markram and his evidence that N/D Assegaai interpreted most of the speakers who spoke in African language.

Witness was not asked re "non-violence" etc. but as he attended meetings with Markram who deposed to this theme being expressed at "many, many meetings", perhaps he could be asked whether he agrees with Markram, et p. 3842 (V.17).

There appears to be nothing of importance in the speeches recorded by witness, other than a couple of references to Religion and the Diety, See. Ex. G.443. None of the accused spoke or were present at this meeting.
