## CONTACT COMM REPORT <br> First semester 1988

Our first meeting in March led to some exciting projects, including taking a eake ( Kavish the: haatel ) to Med sehowl as they tend to.bo forgotiter. We were invited to speak to SAUJS exec which gave us the opfurturity to discuss the history of the anti conscription movement in S.A., the role of the SADF and ECC's aims for the future
Our main aim was to organise a survey on campus that would allow us to make contact with the student body as a whole as well as obtain a measure of the attitudes towards the ECC, alternative national service and the role of the SADF. This was run during the first week of the seaond term and analysis: hass finally got of the ground
Contact hass had problems with reps as cor ors was ondy at the begiming of the second term and our exec rep had to be replaced half way through the term.

A talk at Marquard had to be postponed due to the excitement of the debate. Kriow your rights forums planned for Woolsack and Med school were not a success in that nobody turned up but we believe that such a negative reaction means we have to learn to take a completely new approach and hence Contact is planning ahead with this in mind

At a workshop/meeting at the beginning of the second term Contact decided that more initiative could be taken by the
Comm and that we had a very exciting role to play within the organisation. We hope that this spirit will allow us to establish Contact's role more firmly than it is at the moment.

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Media comm renort

Media also printed nickets in sunnort of Ivan which ECC used on the davs of his trial Media nrinted a namnhlet exndainio the ASP's and these were distributed at the Camnaion launch We also nainted a larce campaion banner to be used bv UCT F.CC throunhout the cambainn. The most excitinn nart of media's work this vear has been the nrintinc of our own nublication called "Rank and Vile" (formerlv called "Tales frimm") This nublication has broucht UCT ECC much sunnort and has taunht media members a larse number of skills.
A.t the befinninn of the second nuarter, media had to be re-assessed Members were feelinn like nart of a orintinn comnanv. Media has attemnted to chance its role, and is now a nlace for anvone with creative talents, a need for skills, and anvone who wants to share a bottle of wine!

Media has about 8 fullv active members with another 4 neon?e who come to recular meetinas.

- screenina UCT ECC T-shirts
- duttina on a cultural evenina
- nreparinc serialised information boards on camnus and in the residences for creatinc awareness about the Ausust ca?l-un and our camnaion for alternatives
- invitinn neonle from other nrocressive cultural oros. to contribute to our internal education
- helninc to organise the annual ECC fair!
- oraanisinc niohts at the theatre (throuch Drama contacts) as fundraisinn ventures

Culture is at present the bionest subcomm. We've had ouite a lot of new recruits who are enjoyinc culture, vet the whole subcomm. feels that we need to be more culturally orientated both in meetinas and in our activities. We've been discussinc our role as culture and how we can fit into the Camnaion and carrv ECC's messane forward. We are verventhusiastic and fee! that we have an imnortant contribution to make.

In the 1 st week of the $2 n d$ term, ECC ran a survey on unner campus and on satellite campuses. The survey was co-ordinated by contact comm who also processed the results. The survey questions were ouite aeneral and covered 4 main areas: (see attached questionnaire)

- attitudes to conscriotion/military service
- attitudes to alternative national service
- attitudes to the role of the SADF
- attitudes to ECC

We oranised the surveyina throunh faculty councils and class reps. especially in some of the more contained faculties en. Enoineerino and Architecture, and on satellite campuses like Med. school and Music and Drama school. Not onlv was this a fairlvefficient method, but it also helned further contact with faculty councils. We also had rovina booths all over campus, in the cafetarias etc.

The results of the survey have been orocessed (see attached conv), but we have not finally analysed them and worked out how we will use them We are considerina publishina them in various campus newspaners, and envisage usina the results as part of our proaramme of lobbvina various campus constituencies nest semester.

## NANSO media workshop

We were approached by NANSO (Namibian National Students' Oraanisation) to assist them with media for their camnaian around Cassinca Day NANSO were very unconfident about their media skills and thoucht ECC produced very lekker media! We had a verv successful media workshop, attended bv about 5 ECC members and about 10 NANSO members, where we produced 3 posters which were subsenuently used reaionally by NANSO. It was a very rewardino workshon, both in terms of personal oains and furtherino our contact with NANSO.

## Lawaaikamp

About 5 ECC members attended the Lawaikamn service in feorae on Sundav 29 May. It was a verv movino and reaeneratino experience for us, and our presence was noted and appreciated by the feorae Civic, and the Lawaikamp community.

On Wed 20 and Thurs 21 March, UCT ECC launched the National Camoaian on campus. There wasn't very much nlannino involved in this, as we decided about 10 days before the time that this was the action that needed to be taken to raise our profile and inform camnus of our cambaian for the rest of the year.

So, we decided that a mini-bazaar was derhaps the most fun wav to do this. ECC had also not done this sort of public, colourful tyne of activity for quite a while on campus - so, both for our morale and for getting students thinkina ECC-wise aoain, we felt this would be anpronriate

A new ECC banner - CAMPAIGN FOR ALTERNATIVE NATIONAL SERVICE - was painted; a pamnhlet outlininc the campaion was printed; all our existino media and left-over T-shirts were hauled out; a HUGE cake in the shane of a rather colourful military base was baked: Forces Favourites was plaved. and CAS was there too.

But the most novel aspect of this launch was that we took it to students. We ran our launch in the Leslie cafetaria on the first day, a suitably venue, but one which does not net used very much for this type of political activitv. (However, NUSAS have taken to holdino fairs there recently!?) on the second day the launch was taken to the Red Level students $u n i o n ~ c a f e t a r i a ~-~ m o r e ~ f a m i l i a r ~ t u r f ~ f o r ~ u s . ~ . ~$

However, both days were extremely successful. He had 2 ECC speakers. one explainina the need for alternatives; the other explainina the format of the Campaion. Quite a few neople sioned up for our ASP as well as joinina ECC. He also raised over R8O.

However, we haven't been able to take this much further, nossibly throunh the lack of a concrete ASP pronosal. We feel it necessary for us to do some hioh-nrofile ECC work acain and to take ECC acain to as yet unchartered constituencies on campus, as well as makino use of the support we already have.

## Anaola Uodate

In the last and very busy week of term, UCT ECC held an Ancola information meetina. We felt that it was verv important to once more raise the issue of the SADF presence in Ancola. Keith fottschalk, a Political Science lecturer at UWC, and expert on Anoolan affairs, spoke about the history of SADF involvement in Anoola, and provided an analvsis of the recent Ancolan summits. Despite there beinc about 3 other meetinas at that lunchtime, our meetino was well attended and verv well received.

The debate was held on the 28 th Anril on camnus. In this renort we shall briefly outline the process that led un to the debate and our aims etc

We felt that this debate would be an excellent onnortunity for neonle in UCT ECC to develon sneakino skills, confidence and knowledne, so our aim was to include as many people as nossible in the process leadino up to the debate.

The followina mrocess took place to choose the sneakers:

1. Evervone in the oro. was invited to a workshon on nublic sneakino where Laurie Nathan helped us by outlinino a few imnortant thinas to remember as a nublic speaker. Each person was then oiven a chance to deliver a speech that had been written bv someone else (en. Biko, Tutu etc.), and was assessed bv the oroun. It was areat to see that in fact evervone was canable of sneakine nublically, and with some trainino, all of us could have mananed to speak on a nublic platform.
2. A few days later the aroup recathered and in this session we worked on ouestions and answers. Each person was then asked a question and the manner in which we answered was assessed. The emphasis was not really so much on the answers aiven, but rather on the way the answer was aiven, the style etc. This session nroved to be a little more difficult and the aroun realised how much we had to ?earn. For our newer members, this session proved very helnful as many issues concerninn ECC policy and strateny were raised and answered collectively. At this session the speakers were chosen.

- it was felt that 1 airl and 1 bov should debate
- both sessions were taken into account - however, the ouestions and answers session seemed to be the decidina factor
- we tried to choose sneakers who would comolement each other in their styles
- in choosinn, newere members felt they were not exnerienced enounh

From there, the two speakers worked closely with Clare and a sunport aroun on strateov and content.

The debate itself was verv successful and we were victorious! f.nclosed are different accounts of the actual debate.

## achievements of the debate:

- we felt that a oreat deal was achieved by the debate, both as an oreanisation and on campus
- we realised the mass supnort we have on camnus
- we raised ECC's orofile and oresented our policy and stratenv to camnus
- ECC members involved in the preparation learnt a areat deal
- we exposed the MSM for what thev really are!
- we realised the canabilities of UCT ECC members as activists and speakers


## Education and Trainina renort

3rd term 1988

Our education proaramme was built on the "Why we ordanise around conscrintion" theme of term 1. Our three workshons were:

- The war in Namibia - video and short discussion
- Riohts and ootions re. the armv (oresented bv CAS)
- Militarisation in South African societv (oresented by us!)

This was the most excitina because four of us researched and nresented it

We have introduced a current affairs slot in $f B$ 's. We have also started inviting interestina sneakers to relieve the bureaucracy of $F B$. For examnle, a conscript spoke about his exneriences in Ancola. We also invited a member of the feoree Civic to sneak about the l.awaikamn removals.

Resources are beinc built un by the secretary and we are constantly advertisinc them.

Our main trainino was in orenaration for the debate. About 10 members went throunh nublic speakinc, question answerino and sneech writino skills traininc. It was a vervexcitinc learnina exnerience and Clare helped us lank!

Dur priorities for next term are:

- oraanisational skills, like chairinc
- more education in the darticinatory vein
- makina national info. and resources accessible to evervone

At the end of the semester and the beainninc of exams, many members are showinc sions of fatioue and the sumptoms of hibernation! He have had a busy and rewardino term, and morale is cenerally rioh as we have made manv excitinc Dlans for the months ahead,
3 Security
Anart from a discussion about security at our weekend away earlier this year, we have not paid much attention to the nractice of securitv measures. There is a ceneral feelino at nresent that such measures seem unnecessarv, but this issue will reouire thorourh discussion in the future.

After National Conference, UCT ECC reassessed the workinc of the front, and decided that we would benefit for more from workino relationshins with various oraanisations than from the buildinc un of a formal front structure.

At present, contact with other oras. is snoradic and informal We do, however, have fairly strong ties with NUSAS at present, with two formallv mandated NUSAS rens. attendino our CB's.

We are hopina that our nrodosed programme of lobbvina in the next semester will lay the aroundwork for more formal and freouent contact with other camous constituencies.

Generallv we have found national contct to be very beneficial We have attempted to makd information and resources nained from the nhonearoun and national nackages available to everyone bv havina a slot for national news at each FB , and keeminn an un-to-date list of resources received. We do feel that we would benefit from direct contact with the other camnus branches, and would like to arrance some sort of camnus Dhone-around.

The visit of the National oraaniser at the beainnino of the term was a definite hioh noint for UCT ECC! We all really dun Clare and she really dua us too! We found her visit esnecially helnful in the area of E\&T, and the Campaicn. Clare was integrally involved in the prenaration for the debate (and discovered her public speakine talent at our workshon!), and was invaluable both in terms of trainio and morale-boostina!

Clare helned us to set up our Campaian structures and nrovided useful criticism of our lack of stratenisinc and broader coals in the camnaion, and Dointed out the need to THINK UCT! We also worked out a nrovisional proaramme for future visits by the No. On both the nersonal and oroanisational level, Clare's visit to UCT was verv snecial and valuable.
