Thank you also for the very interesting manufactured I would like to show this to a few people of the kind sho might be interested for their own private purposes, and I will, of course, bear in mind that you say about the problems involved. But it may be that eventually, in certain circumstances of one kind or snother, you may feel that the obvious difficulties involved in letting a larger number of people see it, or know about it, no longer apply. If you ever do feel this, I would be very grateful if you would let me know: the essence of these things, especially in a country like Britain, is of course sharing it with a lot of people, which might do some good. But naturally I will do nothing without your very clear and specific agreement.

With every good wish for all eventualities: please be assured that if the worst happens you will not be forgotten, and there will be no lack of reminders, from me and many others, to people here.
