



The following advertisement appeared in the Rand Daily Mail and an Afrikaans version thereof in "Die Vaderland" on 31 July 1984 and 1 August 1984, respectively:

"NOTICE is hereby given that the Town Council of Lekoa has resolved subject to the approval of the Minister of Co-operation and Development to increase the various tariffs applicable in the area of jurisdiction of the local authority of Lekoa, with effect from the first day of the month in which the increase in the various tariffs has been published in the Government Gazette. Particulars of the resolutions are available in the office of the Town Clerk during normal office hours until Wednesday 15 August 1984. Any person who wants to object against the proposed increase in tariffs must lodge his objection in writing to the Town Clerk not later than Wednesday 22 August 1984."

The relevant regulation pertaining to the date on which a by-law comes into operation has since been amended and now reads as follows:

"(3) Any by-law shall have the force of law within the area of jurisdiction of the local authority concerned with effect from the date of the publication in the Gazette as provided in subregulation (2)(c) or from any such later date as may be indicated therein."

As no written objection against the proposed increase in tariffs was received the Council must now resolve for the necessary publication of the various tariffs in the Government Gazette.

RESOLVED

- *** 1. That the comments by the Town Treasurer as per Annexure "A" pertaining to the 1984/85 financial year be noted.
- X 2. That the proposed new service charges of R5,50 and R5,90 for Board's dwellings and private houses respectively as well as the proposed new tariffs for the 1984/85 financial year not be implemented. X
- 3. That in regard to (2) above a by-law be promulgated in terms of section 56(1) of the Black Local Authorities Act 1982 (Act 102 of 1982) as amended by Government Notice R.1993 of 16 September 1983 for the promulgation of the existing service charges and tariffs applicable in the area of jurisdiction of the Town Council of Lekoa.
- 4. That in regard to (3) above the Town Clerk be authorized to arrange for the necessary publication of the various tariffs in the Government Gazette.
- 5. That in regard to (1) above the Town Treasurer be requested to compile a new economical budget of income and expenditure for the 1984/85 financial year for consideration by the Town Council of Lekoa.

COMMENTS FROM THE TOWN TREASURER

During an unofficial meeting held by some of the Councillors, the Town Treasurer was requested to cut down on the budget for 1984/85 financial year to the extent that no increases are to be made to the existing tariffs of the Town Council of Lekoa.

The fact that the suggested R5,90 not be implemented at such a late stage and after having taken the consequences of the decision must be seen as bad financial policy.

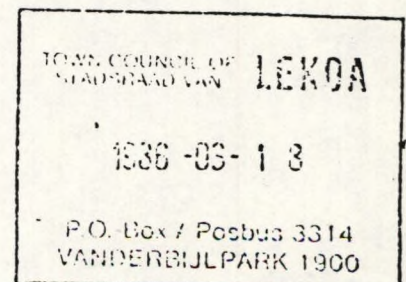
To give sound financial advice on such short notice is impossible as the whole budget will have to be drawn up again to ascertain the minimum requirements of the Town Council.

It must be stressed that the consequences of the cutting of the budget will be to the detriment of the people of Lekoa. Services, Health Services and Maintenance will have to be cut down drastically to be able to subsidize the increases in water and electricity charges from the suppliers.

After a new budget has been compiled the full consequence will be submitted for approval by the Town Council of Lekoa.

IT IS RECOMMENDED

1. That it be noted that a new budget will have to be compiled.
2. That the budget referred to in (1) be economic.
3. That no increases in the current tariffs be considered when compiling the budget.
4. That the new budget be submitted to the Town Council of Lekoa for approval.
5. That the Department of Co-operation and Development be informed that the budget that was submitted for approval not be approved but a new budget will be submitted for approval.
