Whereas by subsection (3) of section twelve of the National Registration Act, 1939^(a), it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that that Act shall extend to the Isle of Man as if it were part of the United Kingdom, subject to any exceptions, modifications and adaptations specified in the Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Him as aforesaid and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The National Registration Act, 1939, shall extend to the Isle of Man as if it were part of the United Kingdom, subject to the following exceptions and adaptations:—

- (1) In the application of the said Act to the Isle of Man—
 - (a) "appropriate Minister" means the Lieutenant Governor;
 - (b) "Registrar-General" means the Registrar-General of Births, Marriages and Deaths appointed under the Civil Registration and Dissenters' Marriage Act, 1924;
 - (c) references to the Census Act, 1929, and to "information" shall be substituted respectively for references to the Census Act, 1920^(b), and "indictment".

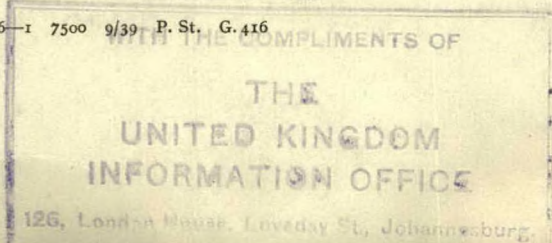
