1. $\because \mathrm{ARF}:$

The Cougress of South Africen Studerts, herein-efter referred :o as COSAS.

$\therefore 1$. io normalise the relationship tetween students, teachers a:t. parents.
2.2. To create a spirit of trust ard co-operation between studerts and parents.
2.3. To create a spirit of trust, responsibility, understanding and creative companionship between students.
2.4. To impress on the student the essence of his being even after completion of his studies.
2.5. To s.trive towards an education dynamic, free and compulsary for the betterment of society.
2.6. To become practically involved in projects contributing to the improvement of CQSAS in pursuance of the above objects.
3. MEMBERSHIP:
3.1. Membership shall be open to ell students in South Africa.
3.2. Branch membership shall be open to areas which have at leasit four members of COSAS, subject to the acceptance of the National Council.
3.3. Students who are members of SRC's affiliated to COSAS may - become members of COSAS.
3.4. The membership fee for all members of COSAS shall be R1.00
per ennum. per onnum.
4. MATIONAL CONGRESS OF COSAS:
4.1. The National Congress shall be the supreme policy body or COSAS and shall meet at least once a year.
4.2. The National Congress shall be constituted as follows: Members of the National Executive Committee shall each have one vote. Branches may nominate up to five of their members es delegates to the National Congress, and each eligible member shall heve one vote. Members in areas where there are no branches shall enjoy the same nomination and voting rights es branch delegates.
4.3. The chairperson shall have both a deliberative and a casting vote at the Congress.
4.4. The National Congress'shall elect the members of the National Executive Committee by majority vote.
4.5. In eddition to the annual National Congress, further meetings of the National Congress shall be convened in the following circumstances: When the National Executive Committee so resolves by majority vote. When one third of the branches petition the National Executive Committee for a meeting of the Netional Congress.

## 5. STRUCTURE:

5.1. NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

5.1.4. The Executive Committee shall meet at least four times per onnum.
5.1.5." The Natlonal Executive "Comittee is charged with carrying out the decisions and purposes of the National Congress and the National Executive Council.
5.1.6. The Nationai Executive Committee shall notify every branch before it co-opts ony person.
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### 5.2. NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

5.2.1. The National Executive Council shall consist of the members of the Nationel Executive Committee. Two delegates of each regional committee two representatives of the Executive ony two members of every brench not included in e regional committee.
5.2.2. The National Executive Council shall be convened four times per onnum.
5.2.3. The National Executive Council is responsible for making decisions to enact the resolution of the National Congress.
5.3. REGIONAL COMMITTEES
5.3.1. Regional committees shall be formed in areas which have three of more COSAS branches.
5.3.2. Regional committees shall be elected by the Committees of all branches in the region.
5.3.3. The following mecbers shall be elected to the regional committee:

3. Secretary

6. Three additional members
S.2.4. Regional Executive Corinittee members shall hold office for the duration of one year and may be re-elected.
7. 7.5. Recional comittees shall meet at least once a month, unless the situation derands otherwise.
5.4. BRANCH COMMITTEES
5.4.1. A brench of COSAS may be established, subject to the ecceptance of the National Council (where there is no regional committee);
where there are at least four members fo COSAS, at individual schools in rural or isolated areas,
where number of schools comblne to form e COSAS brench, either schools with affiliated SRC's or schools without SRCs
5.4.2. members, SRC members, or school members as the case may be, may meet to elect the members of a branch committee.
5.4.3. COSAS branch committees shall consist of the following members:

10. Vice-cheirperson
11. Publicity secretary
12. Secretary
13. Three edditional members.
5.4.4. Branch members shall be elected at the beginning of the year end hold office for that year, but may be re-elected.
5.4.5. COSAS branches shall meet at least once a month.
5.5. STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE COUNCILS (SRC)

Believing that autonomous SRCs are a necessity at afl schools, and wishing to affiliate with them, COSAS recommends the following constitution:
5.5.1. Realising that students need greater understanding of each other as students, or the school staff, and of matters concerning education, and realising that teachers need great co-operation in their educational endeavours, and a serious approach from students, we hereby resolve to establish an SRC.as set out below:

### 5.5.2. NAME:

The Students Representative Council; herein-after referred to as SRC.
5.5.3. AIMS

1. To assist the staff to instill responsitility, deterrination, farsizhtedness and dignity into students.
2. To activate students in all watters affectirg the student concerning the school, their education end developerent.
3. To represent the student body wherever necessary.
4. To promote students developement from the gressroots level.
5. To promote the aims and objectives of COSAS amongst students.
5.5.4. STRUCTURE
6. The SRC w1ll divide its members into the following committees:
B. The Executive Committee
b. The Entertbinmerit Committee
c. The Programmes Committee
g. The Welfare Committee
7. Each committee shall have the right to incorporate other students.
8. Committees may seek advice and assistance from the school sterf.
L. Committeas sholl design or amend their own constitution or structure at their own discretion, subject to the approval of the SRC.
9. The SRC shall encourage Christion Movements to be established and have a strong working relationship with them.
5.5.5. NEETINGS
10. The Executive sholl meet from time to time as it decides for the proper running of the SRC.
?. The Executive shall cell mass meetings of the student . body whenever it deems fit.

11. Other committees may convene meetings in matters within the sphere of their responsibility, with epproval of the SRCs.
L. Kass meetiags by ony committee must be called with the epproval of the Executive committee.
12. Bexbers of comrilttees sholl be elected at a meeting of ell students ragistered as members of the SRC, and are norrelly elected in February of each year.
Members of committees shall hold office for one school year but may be re-elected during their period of attendance ot a particular acholl, unless a contradictory ruling is made by the disciplinary committee.

### 5.5.6. MEMBERSHIP

Any atudent at achool may register as a member of the SRC of that achoci. Students who are members of SRCs affilisted to cosas may become members of COSAS.

### 5.5.7. affiliation

All student Representotive Councils are encouraged to offihate to cosas.

Shall supervise all the aspects ond activities of the members or SRCs within the ares of its jurisdiction.
Sholl review the progress of SACs.
Shall be responalble for all National projects and programme:
in ita ores.
Shall have the discretion to run its own projects.
hiere there is no regional committee or src, the branch exeCUTIVE CONeITTEE aholl liose directly with the National Exe cutive Comaltter.
Assume the duties of the Regionel comaltee.
Assume the dutles or the SRCs.
6.5. SRC EXECUTIVE COMMITEE

Seek to promote e well difeiplined stucent body, without the use of brutal or emotional measures, in conjunction $w 1$ th the staff.
Stimulate students to discuss the importance of discipline, particularly over their achool work, punctuallty and co-ope ration, and their responsibility to the student body.

## 7. DUTIES OF COMMLTEE MEMBER

7.1. THE NATIONAL EXECUTIVE
7.1.1. President

Shall be the chief executive officer
Shall represent cosas at all times.
Shall preside over all meetings of the National Executive
Netional Counc11, and Netional Congress.
Shall issue stotements on beholf of COSAS, with the opp-
roval of the other Executive members.
7.1.2. Vice-president

Sholl deputise for the Prealdent
Shall ossist the preaident in his duties.
Shall cerry out essigneenta for the National Executive.
7.1.3. Secretary General

Shall be responsible for the correspondence of the organd setion.
Sholl keep the records of correspondence.
Shall keep the register of oll meetings on behalf of the President.

Shell conduct oll correspondence end keep records.
Shall register members onc issue memiership cards.
Shall administe: financisi matters in occordence with the instructions of the comilttee.

## .7.2.4. orgendser

Shall carry out the projecta of the organisation.
shell be reaponsible for orgonising meetings ond venues. Shall co-ordinate activities with the Region/Branch/SRC.
7.2.5. Publicity Secretary

Shall be responsible for the distribution of ilterature, and pamphiets.
Shall attend to the production and distribution of local publications.
Shall ottain approval for local putifations from the Nationsl Publicity Secretery.

### 7.2.6. Additiongl Members

Sholl essiet in the duties of the Executive.
Shall deputise in case of the atsence of on officer or member.

Sholl carry out asaipnments as requested ty the Executive.
8. STAFF MEMBERS

The National Executive Council may employ full time assistance from persons who ore no longer atudents to assist in the work of çosas, with job descriptions and conditions of engegement opproved by the National Congress. Such starf members shall at sll times be subject to the direction of the National Congress through the National Executive, and be appointed with a specific job description and responsibility to one of the officers of the National Executive. Staff members may be Invited to attend any committee, council or Congress, but sholl not be voting nembers thereof.
9. DISCIPLINE

The National Council enall serve as the Disciplinary Comilttee when charges are brought against a member of coshs, or a comalttee member. The National Executive, Regional Committees and Branch Committees shall NOT have power to act against n member on matters of expulsion, without the mandate of the National

Counc11. The member concerned shall have the right to present his/her case, and to oppeal ogainst ony decision.
10. ASSOCIATES

Associate status may be accorded to any individuel or orgenisation upon application to the Hationsl Executive Comilttee. The National Executive Committen sholl retain on sbsolute discretion whether or not eccord essocinte status to any person or organisation so applying, and conflict being remedied at the ensuing National Congress.
Persons and organisotions enjoying associste status ashall be kept informed of the activities of cosis, and shall be invited to meetings of COSAS when deemed desirable by cosas. They shall however have no right to vote at any cosas meeting.
11. LECAL PERSONA AND FINAMCIAL MATTERS COSAS stall be body corporate with perpetual succession and the power to hold property in its own nome.
The algnatures of two members of the Executive Comiltiee shall

- be nesessary to operpte a:y tpmilne account of coshs. At lest three signetorter =ust te arircvec ty the aprcpriate cosintiees In eact: cese.
All poyments (exept Petty Cash disbursemente) zhall be oase by way of cheque paysents.

12. AMEHDMENT

Any provisions of this Constitution may te dmentet by a ress:utlon sucborted ty two thirss of those present ens votine i: 0 National Congress of COSAS.
