

MEMORANDUM ON S.J. ELLIS. DET/SGT.

This witness's evidence does not appear to be of any importance. He reports on three meetings, 511, 512, 513 at pp. 6303, 6309, 6310 (V.32).

Despite his statement that when interpreters are used it is possible to record everything said by the speakers, p. 6313 (V.32), it was clearly established in x-examination that even on such occasions he did not record the speeches in full but only took down what he thought was important from the viewpoint of security. p. 6315 - 6'16 (V.32). It is difficult to appreciate however, why the fact that Cohen played a guitar should be of importance to security. p. 6318 (V.32). He says he may have heard speakers repudiating the use of violence, but cannot now recollect.

Meeting No. 512:

p.6309.(V.32). This meeting lasted 2½ hrs. the witness's notes of speeches hardly cover half a typed page. See Ex. G. 936.

Meeting No. 513:

p. 6310 (V.32). Witness has only recorded speeches made by two speakers. There must obviously have been more speakers and it is not clear why only the speeches of Dr. Hoosa (45) and S. Shall (67) appear to have been recorded.
