

# Resolutions.

1. That this meeting of the Transvaal African Congress held at the Dougall Hall Marabastad, Pretoria, respectfully urges the Union Government of South Africa to repeal, throughout the Union of South Africa, the Pass laws, as are considered by this meeting a relic of the old slavery days, and are provocative and antagonistic to the feelings of any civilised human being to be debarred the freedom of movement in any democratic country.
2. That this meeting considers it extremely degrading to both the Police and the African man or woman, accosted in the street or road to be ordered to fumble into his or her pockets, like an alien, for the production of his or her documents of Identity.  
We consider the Tax receipt a sufficient badge of Identity to be carried by every adult African man or a Protection Certificate by minor African males.
3. That the Union Government of South Africa, in its laudable Social Security Measures, be respectfully urged to establish industries in urban and rural areas for the absorption of all African labour - and thus eliminate the congestion of prisons under section 17 of the Vagrants' Law.
4. That in the opinion of this meeting the five morgen of land allotted to each African family in the Transvaal under the Trust Farms Act, are inadequate to meet the necessary requirements of each family concerned, and that the Union Government of South Africa be respectfully urged, to suspend the operation of that section of the Law until such time as adequate lands shall be available.

5. That this meeting of the Transvaal African Congress declares that it has full confidence in the leadership of Dr A. B. Xuma as President-General of African National Congress.

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
