INTRODUCTION:

Although further progress was made in reducing the housing backlog, the activities of the Division were curtailed owing to the delay in obtaining approval for new schemes.

The year's construction figure of some 1995 houses, was below average.

A start was made on the construction of:-

458 houses at Chiawelo and Dhlamini. (a)

50 houses for Ex-Servicemen at South Western Bantu Areas. (b)

(c) 50 houses at the Orlando West Hostel.

100 Timber houses for Coloureds at Riverlea.

Pimville (7,500 families), situated west of the Menz line, remains the only major Bantu slum to be cleared.

- (d) 10 Kitchens at Chiawelo.

6. Preventive Health Centre, Tladi.

The T.B. Clinic at Tladi at a cost of R18,609 was completed in August 1964 and on the 23rd February, 1965, the Council approved additions to the departmental construction of a Preventive Health Centre on Portion 1 on Stand 144 Tladi at a cost of R13,415.

Construction work on the additions started in May, 1965, and the project should be complete by the end of August 1965.

7. Klipspruit Township : Housing Loan.

On the 27th October 1964 the Council resolved that an application be made to the Bantu Housing Board for an economical housing loan for 78l type 51/6 houses, 264 type 51/7 houses, 208 two-roomed row houses, 310 four-roomed flats, 22 classrooms, 3 caretakers' cottages and 3 schools in Klipspruit.

Construction work on this project should start in July 1965.

8. Jabulani Civic Centre: Post Office and Telephone Exchange.

On the 30th March, 1965, the Council agreed to the departmental construction of a Post Office and Telephone Exchange at Jabulani Civic Centre at a cost of R19,000 (16,000 previously voted). The Chief Housing Engineer was authorised to carry out the work at an estimated cost of R35,000. Construction work should start in October, 1965.

9. Pound and Dog Destructor Chamber: Nancefield.

On the 30th March, 1965, the Council approved the construction of a Pound and Dog Destructor Chamber at Nancefield at an estimated cost of R31,000. Work has not yet started.

10. Alterations and Additions to Administration Offices. Moroka and Jabavu.

On the 25th May 1965, the Council approved expenditure of R25,165 for alterations and additions to the Administration Offices at Moroka and Jabavu.

It is expected that construction work will start in July 1965.

11. Application for Housing Loan, 134 Houses Dube Village North of Godfrey Street.

Approval was received in June 1965 from the Bantu Housing Board for 134 houses at Dube Village North of Godfrey Street, at an estimated cost of R64,119. This project should be completed by March, 1966.

12. Proposed Mens' Hostel: Lifateng.

On the 26th March 1957 the Council approved a layout plan for housing approximately 3,000 Bantu men in the proposed Lifateng Hostel and the approval of the Minister of Bantu Administration and Development was subsequently received.

On the 25th May 1965, the Council resolved that the layout plan be amended to accommodate 4,192 Bantu men and on the 29th June 1965, approved of an application being made to the Bantu Housing Hoard and the Hon. the Minister of Bantu Administration and Development, for an economic housing loan of R999,884 for the hostel and it's normal amenities.

13. 8 Experimental Houses (Timber) Riverlea.

On the 25th August, 1964, the Council agreed to the construction of eight experimental economic houses at Riverlea using brick veneered wall and timber framing methods at an estimated cost of R28,000. This project is the first of its kind to be undertaken by a local authority in the republic. The scheme was based on four different National Housing Office plans varying in area from 892 to 1059 square feet plus garages. Each house has three to four bedrooms, lounge, kitchen, bathroom, separate toilet and garage. The work was completed in January 1965, and was opened by the Mayor on Saturday 27th February 1965.

14. Economic National Housing Loan 100 Sites. Riverlea.

On the 8th December, 1964, the Council agreed to the construction of 100 Brick Veneer Timber Framed Houses, with interior panels, including water and sewer connections to existing mains, house wiring and cable connections, garage and fencing, in accordance with plans approved by the National Housing Commission at an estimated cost of R460,000.

Work began in March 1965, and is expected to be completed by the end of November. 1965.

15. Dube Library.

On the 26th January 1965, the Council approved expenditure of R15,000 for the erection and furnishing of the library at Dube. Building materials have been delivered and work will soon start.

16. Bantu Beer Off-Sales Depots.

On the 26th January 1965 the Council agreed to construct two Off-Sales Beer Depots at Stand 1780 Chiawelo Ext. 2 and Stand 1382 Naledi. It is expected that construction work will begin in July 1965.

17. Housing Loan for Schools: Soweto.

On the 29th October 1963 the Council resolved that application be made for a housing loan of R59,600 for four schools, four caretakers' cottages and twelve additional classrooms in Soweto. The resolution was amended on the 28th January 1964. Approval of the loan has been received and the Bantu Education Department has found it necessary to change the site of one school and amend the allocation of the additional classrooms at the other schools.

GENERAL:

The period of office of the members of the Advisory Board for Hantu Building Workers expired on the 22nd January 1965 and the Council, on the 27th April, 1965, nominated the Manager, Non-European Affairs Department and the Chief Housing Engineer for appointment by the Minister of Labour.

Bantu Wages and European salaries increased and together with higher cost of materials, increased the costs of new construction projects. Applications for increases on approved loans are therefore necessary and further delays are likely.

CONSTRUCTION WORK:

Houses : Bantu.

During the year, 1995 houses were constructed of types 51/9, 51/30a, 51/6, 51/6a, 51/6b and 51/7 together with schools and bottle stores.

Fencing and various additions to houses have been carried out. Over 1741 latrines with water closets were erected.
